#### II. COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS

**Chairman Vicente Pangelinan:** I would like to go ahead and have the author of Bill 100, Speaker Won Pat to make comments about the bill. I have Mr. Anthony Blaz and Mr. John Camacho that are also here to testify on Bill 100. Speaker Won Pat?

#### (a) Bill Sponsor Summary

**Speaker Won Pat.:** Thank you very much. Bill No. 100 basically is requiring that the deposit of any unclaimed or unpaid tax refund checks would go into the Income Tax Refund Reserve Fund, which currently exists. In Section 2116 of 5 GCA, it provides that any and all checks, which shall have been unclaimed or outstanding for more than three years from the date of audit, shall be paid into the Treasurer as revenue of the general fund this particular bill has yet to be escheated into the government. Bill 100 also recognizes that efforts continue to be made by Governor Calvo and his administration to distribute 6,000 unclaimed tax refund checks worth approximately \$19 million dollars. As of May 7th, 2013, only 429 checks worth approximately \$484,000 were claimed.

Bill No. 100 seeks to do three things: (1) to capture unclaimed tax refund checks beginning with those checks that will escheat to the government of Guam beginning at the end of fiscal year 2013; (2) it will also authorize that such tax refund checks be deposited into the Income Tax Reserves Fund to help pay out future tax refunds and (3) to help the government of Guam comply with the District Court's order to pay out tax refunds within six months from the date of the filing. October 15, 2013 is the deadline to pay tax refunds to tax payers who filed on April 15, 2013 and whose paper work are clear of questions. This concept or law is in existence and was passed by the past Legislature in July 20, 1960. In Sections 21116 of 5 GCA Chapter 21, it would add a new (e), which will be the same language as (d) except that it will single out tax refunds. Thank you very much Mr. Chairman.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much Madam Speaker. Mr. Blas and Mr. Camacho once again, please identify yourself for the record and provide your testimony.

#### (b) Testimony

#### 1. Mr. Anthony Blaz, Deputy Director, Department of Administration

Mr. Anthony Blaz: Thank you Mr. Speaker and members of the committee. My name is Tony Blaz and I'm the Deputy Director of the Department of Administration. I'm here to provide testimony on Bill 100-32. Again, Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this Bill, An act to add a new Item (e) to §21116 of Chapter 21, Division 2, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to requiring the deposit of unclaimed or unpaid tax refund checks into the Income Tax Refund Reserve Fund.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much Mr. Blaz. Mr. Camacho.

#### 2. Mr. John Camacho, Director, Department of Revenue and Taxation

**Mr. John Camacho:** Again, thank you Senators for allowing me this opportunity to do an oral testimony on Bill 100, which requires the unclaimed refund checks after a period of 4 years to be recorded under the Income Tax Reserve Fund to help alleviate the refunds for the year. This will alleviate the refunds for the appropriate year. I see that as a plus for this Government and the Department of Revenue and Taxation fully supports this bill.

**Chairman Vicente Pangelinan:** Thank you very much Mr. Camacho. Speaker Won Pat did you have any more questions?

**Speaker Won Pat:** Just one question, I know that I gave the figure from May 7th and the dollar amount is different so you have distributed \$646...

**Mr. Anthony Blaz:** \$646, Madam Speaker - 601 checks and as of today we have \$626,491.02 is what we have now.

**Speaker Won Pat:** And the date was as of yesterday?

Mr. Anthony Blaz: As of yesterday, I'm sorry. Today, we're just doing the processing so at the end of the day, we'll have more specifics.

**Speaker Won Pat:** And what is the balance now?

**Mr. Anthony Blaz:** I think the balance is ... One of my staff might have the number real quick - \$12,872,748.05.

**Speaker Won Pat:** These have yet to be escheated to the government and I know you said a 4-year period. Prior to this, what has happened to these monies? Prior to now with what Bill 100 intends to do. So let's take it back 4 years...

Mr. Anthony Blaz: In fiscal year 2009, any escheatment for the current one, we only escheat up until the end of the fiscal year. So whatever the amount that's stale-dated, you have one year first and then you have three years to claim. At the end of the fiscal year that amount will be escheated into the Treasurer.

**Speaker Won Pat:** Has there been any cases where after it has been escheated to the government that claimants will come to the government?

Mr. Anthony Blaz: There have been a few instances when people will come back, but it's very rare. The unclaimed ones in the list came out, before that it's very rare. For example, when you

file a tax refund, people want to get their tax refund, so there's an incentive to go and get it for up to four years.

**Speaker Won Pat:** This law has been existence since 1960's.

Mr. Anthony Blaz: 1976.

**Speaker Judith Won Pat:** So that means that every year - 4 years after - those unclaimed checks have been escheated to the government of Guam. My next question is that for this particular fiscal year, has any of these monies been factored in as part of revenues to be used by the government of Guam for appropriation?

Mr. Anthony Blaz: Currently, we have \$3,167,000 right now in one of the accounts escheated for unclaimed funds and I believe the amount is \$3.167 and that amount is escheated for the fiscal 2013 appropriation. The opportunity is available. I know one of our staff is reviewing one of their accounts and is working with the OFB to provide information on the specifics that especially with budgetary issues, we have to make sure that those items are given to your office as well.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Thank you very much Madam Speaker. Senator Muna Barnes.

**Senator Muna Barnes:** Thank you Mr. Chair, as a follow up question; the commitment of the Administration is to publish the unclaimed tax returns. Since that publication - I know you have three lists up to date and you have one more coming...

Mr. Anthony Blaz: No, we sent the three listings from A-Z.

**Senator Muna Barnes:** With those publications, have there been any constituents coming back to claim.

Mr. Anthony Blaz: Yes, as of yesterday we had 600 people that came out for a total of 626 for one month. At the beginning when they first made the announcement, a bunch of people were at DOA; about 154 were there on the first day. After that it started to taper down to 90 and 91 and yesterday we only had 32. So we're trying to encourage people, it's on the DOA website, the Governor's website, and DRT website, it's in gas stations and other public places for people to have the opportunity to take care of the refunds.

Chairman Vicente Pangelinan: Senator Tom Ada, Senator Limtiaco, Senator Rodriguez, and Senator Chris Duenas. Thank you very much and Si Yu'os Ma'ase for your testimony this afternoon.

This concludes the testimony on Bill No. 100-32. There being no additional individuals to present any additional testimony, this Committee will continue to remain open for the acceptance of any additional information or public testimony on the bill discussed. #### 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan 3 finds that I Maga'låhen Guåhan recently ordered the publication of a list of 4 individuals that have not claimed their tax refund checks in an effort to distribute over 6,000 checks that remain unclaimed. A number of these 5 checks date back to 2009. Although policies of the Internal Revenue 6 7 Service do not require the publication of unclaimed tax refund checks, I 8 Liheslatura finds that it is I Maga'låhen Guåhan's desire that such checks be 9 returned to their rightful owners. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds, however, that despite efforts to return unclaimed tax refund checks, there might be 10

- 1 instances where some of these checks continue to remain unclaimed.
- 2 Under such circumstances, Guam law requires that unclaimed or unpaid
- 3 tax refund checks, which remain unclaimed or outstanding for more than
- 4 three years from the date of audit, shall be paid into the Treasury as
- 5 revenue of the General Fund.

I understand the intent of Bill 100-32. The Department of Administration is in favor of the bill. The Department and this Administration has always prioritized the payment of tax refunds. We appreciate *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* foresight to enable the Administration to use the escheated money to pay for tax refunds.

The Department, through the Proa Newsletter, has released a listing of all unclaimed tax refunds. As of yesterday, we have processed \$646,491.02 reissued unclaimed tax refunds and we continue to process. The total eligible for escheatment will be reduced as taxpayers continue to come make a claim at the Department.

But this Administration has worked hard to exhaust all opportunities to get these funds back to the rightful owners. Governor Calvo is committed to paying tax refunds by ordering that the Department issue a listing of all unclaimed tax refunds. The Governor is committed to doing this on a yearly basis. We want our people to know is that there is no law in Guam's books that require the Department of Administration to publish the listing of unclaimed tax refunds. The Government could have just escheated the funds after the four (4) year period. **But we didn't**. We decided to give that money back to their rightful owners by informing the public through various media outlets.

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

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

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

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that I Maga'låhen Guåhan recently ordered the publication of a list of 3 4 individuals that have not claimed their tax refund checks in an effort to 5 distribute over 6,000 checks that remain unclaimed. A number of these checks date back to 2009. Although policies of the Internal Revenue 6 7 Service do not require the publication of unclaimed tax refund checks, I Liheslatura finds that it is I Maga'låhen Guåhan's desire that such checks be 8 9 returned to their rightful owners. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds, however, that despite efforts to return unclaimed tax refund checks, there might be 10

- 1 instances where some of these checks continue to remain unclaimed.
- 2 Under such circumstances, Guam law requires that unclaimed or unpaid

- deposited into the *Income Tax Refund Reserve Fund* established pursuant to
- 11 Chapter 50 of 11GCA, and shall be expended in accordance with §50105 of
- 12 11GCA."
- 13 Section 3. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon
- 14 enactment.
