AN ACT TO AMEND §58104, CHAPTER 58, TITLE 12 OF THE **GUAM** CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO THE INCLUSION **OF** GREEN TECHNOLOGY AS AN **FOR** ACCEPTABLE ACTIVITY ELIGIBILITY **OF** A QUALIFYING CERTIFICATE APPLICATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the Qualifying Certificate program was created as an economic incentive to entice potential investors to Guam. Qualifying Certificates are granted on the basis of investment commitment, the potential for creating new employment and the expansion of island industries. According the Guam Economic Development Authority, the Qualifying Certificate program has realized approximately one billion, five hundred million dollars (\$1,500,000,000.00) since its inception.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that when an application is approved, a contract is executed between the government of Guam and the beneficiary of the Qualifying Certificate. This contract allows for certain tax rebates and abatements on the basis that the beneficiary meets certain requirements, including employment and investment, pursuant to existing statute.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that Guam is home to many natural resources including its waters, winds and land. In recent years, there have been collective efforts to identify innovative ways of preserving and protecting our environment. There must be a concerted attempt to expand local industries in Guam 5 that strengthen and reinforce current environmental and conservation efforts. Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to ensure that green technology is an acceptable activity for eligibility of a Qualifying Certificate application. 7 Section 2. §58104, Chapter 58, Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read: "§ 58104. Eligibility Defined. A Qualifying Certificate shall only be issued to the following entities: 12 Any trust, partnership, sole proprietorship, Limited Liability Partnership (LLP), Limited Liability Company (LLC), corporation formed under the laws of Guam, or possessions corporation as defined in §58106 of this Chapter, engaged, or about to engage in any of the following activities: (1) agriculture; (2) aquaculture; (3) mariculture; (4) manufacturing; (5) commercial fishing; (6) services;

For purposes of this Paragraph, a "minor" is a person under the age of eighteen (18). 3 (15) The manufacture, distribution and sale of non-petroleum based fuels 4 5 that include, but are not limited to biofuels such biodiesel and ethanol and hydrogen fuels. 6 (16) The establishment of industries and activities that support current 7 8 initiatives associated with the preservation and protection of Guam's 9 natural resources, also known as green technology. Such industries and activities shall include, but not be limited to, energy efficiency, 10 renewable energy and environmental cleanup." 11 Section 3. Enactment. The provisions of this Act shall become effective 12 13 ninety (90) days upon enactment. **Section 4.** Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any 14 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall 15 not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect 16 17 without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this 18 Law are severable.
