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§50413. Severability.

2 **§50401. Definitions.**

- a) "Administrator" means the administrator of the Guam Film
 Office, who *shall* be the Director of the Guam Economic
 Development Authority or his/her designee.
- "Charitable or student films" shall mean commercials, motion 6 b) pictures, television, videotapes, or still photography produced by a 7 nonprofit organization that is registered with the Department of 8 Revenue and Taxation or the Internal Revenue Service as a charitable 9 organization or is produced by students of an educational institution, 10 and for which no person, directly or indirectly, shall receive a profit 11 from the marketing and production of the film or from showing the 12 films, tapes, or photos. 13
- c) "Commercial films," *shall* mean and include all activity attendant
 to filming any entertainment or advertising programs for any media
 now known or hereafter created.
- 17d) "Filming"/"Production" shall mean and include all activity18attendant to staging or shooting commercial motion pictures,19television shows or programs, and commercial still photography,20video tapes, computer-based programs, or other visual reproduction21technology now known or hereafter created. The period of filming22includes the set-up, strike and time of photography.
- "Government" shall mean the Government of Guam, 23 its e) authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees of 24 offices departments, agencies, autonomous agencies, 25 or instrumentalities. 26

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f) "News Media" shall mean the photographing, filming or

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videotaping for the purpose of spontaneous, unplanned television 1 news broadcast or reporting for print media by journalists, reporters, 2 photographers or camera operators. 3

- "Private Property" shall mean any property not owned by the 4 g) Government of Guam on which filming would not interfere with 5 public right of way, access or safety. 6
 - "Studio" shall mean a fixed place of business where filming h) activities (motion or still photography) are regularly conducted upon the premises.
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§50402. Guam Film Office.

There is hereby established within the Guam Economic Development 11 Authority a Guam Film Office. The Administrator of the Guam Economic 12 Development Authority shall be responsible for the administration of the 13 Guam Film Office. 14

§50403. Rules and Regulations. 15

a) Rules and Regulations. The Administrator shall establish a 16 committee comprised of individuals and representatives of Non 17 Governmental Organizations that have substantial experience in the 18 film, video and media fields in order to cause the promulgation of rules, 19 regulations and fees to govern the form, time and location of filming 20 activity set forth within Guam. The committee shall allow for the full 21 participation of any member of the public during its deliberations. The 22 rules and regulations *shall* also provide for the issuance of permits, 23 notification of permit denial and a process of appeal. The rules, 24 regulations, and fees shall be adopted in accordance with the 25 Administrative Adjudication Act, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, 26

Chapter 9, within ninety (90) days upon the enactment of this Article. 1 2 The rules and regulations *shall* be based upon the following criteria: The health and safety of all persons; 3 1. 2. Avoidance of undue disruption of all persons within the 4 affected area: 5 The safety of property in Guam; and 3. 6 7 4. Traffic congestion at particular locations in Guam §50404. Powers and Duties. The Guam Film Office shall have the following 8 powers and duties: 9 10 a) To promote, encourage and advertise the use of Guam facilities and services for the production of films, videos, television programs, audio 11 recordings, computer-generated and other media-related products. 12 To provide support services to visiting and local production 13 b) 14 companies, including assistance to film, video and media producers in securing necessary permits or permissions from government of Guam 15 authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees of departments, 16 agencies, autonomous agencies, offices or instrumentalities. 17 To develop and update annually a resource guide of viable 18 c) filming locations in Guam, available video and media production facilities, 19 permitting requirements, and tax incentives. 20 21 d) To work in coordination with the Guam Visitors Bureau to conduct and attend trade shows and production workshops to promote 22 Guam to the national and international film industries. 23 To promote and attract business activities in film, video, 24 e) computer-generated and other media production activity in Guam and take 25 any other administrative action which may improve Guam's film, video and 26 media production industries in national and international markets. 27

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f) To accept any funds, gifts, donations, bequests or grants of funds from private, federal, and public sources for the purpose of this Act.

g) To create a "one stop permitting" process by formulating and proposing rules and regulations for standardized permits which *shall* be used by government of Guam, its authorized agents, officers, representatives and employees of departments, agencies, autonomous agencies, offices or instrumentalities to include any requirements set forth in this Act.

§50405. Guam Film Office Fund. There is established a fund to be known as 9 the Guam Film Office Fund, which shall be administered by the Guam 10 Economic Development Authority Guam Film Office and be maintained 11 separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam, 12 including the General Fund of the government of Guam. Independent 13 records and accounts *shall* be maintained in connection therewith. Funds of 14 the Guam Film Office Fund shall be used exclusively for the administration 15 and operations of the Guam Film Office. All funds collected from fees, 16 charges or fines levied pursuant to this Chapter shall be deposited into the 17 Guam Film Office Fund and all interest earned by the Guam Film Office 18 Fund shall accrue. Any unencumbered funds remaining in the Guam Film 19 Office Fund at the end of each fiscal year shall remain in that Fund. The 20 Guam Film Office Fund shall be subject to audits by the Office of Public 21 22 Accountability.

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§50406. Permits Required.

a) Permit Required. No person *shall* use any government street, alley,
sidewalk, park, pier, way or other public property owned or controlled
by the Government of Guam for the purpose of making commercial
films without first applying for and receiving a permit from the Guam

Film Office Administrator or his/her designee, provided that the 1 provisions of this chapter *shall* not apply to or be construed to affect (1) 2 news media and (2) filming solely for private-family use. 3 b) No person *shall* use any private property for the purpose of making 4 commercial films without first applying for and receiving a permit from 5 Film Office the Guam Administrator his/her 6 or designee. 7 Notwithstanding the foregoing, the provisions of this chapter *shall* not apply to or be construed to affect the following filming on private 8 9 property: 1. Filming which requires no parking variances and uses no 10 11 public property or rights of way on public property; 2. Filming which does not impair the quiet enjoyment of 12 the surrounding properties; 13 3. Filming which does not involve the use of any 14 pyrotechnic devices; 15 4. A licensed business which regularly employs a licensed 16 17 pyrotechnic operator; 5. Filming by news media; 18 Filming solely for private-family use; or 19 6. Filming which does not interfere with the public's use of 20 7. 21 government property. c) Except as provided herein, each applicant must comply with all local 22 and federal laws and regulations, and must obtain all necessary permits 23 and licenses as a precondition for the commencement of commercial 24 film production hereunder. Thereafter, the permittee shall remain in full 25 compliance with all local and federal laws, regulations, permits and 26 licenses throughout the filming. 27

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d) Upon reasonable notice by the applicant, the Administrator or his/her 1 designee is authorized, upon showing of good cause, to change the 2 conditions under which a permit has been issued, provided that the 3 requirements of this chapter are met and the government of Guam 4 department, agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality can 5 undertake all necessary administrative review within the time requested. 6 **§50407.** General Exemptions. The provisions of this Article *shall* not apply 7 to or affect: 8 A. News Media. Reporters, photographers or cameramen in the 9 10 employ of a newspaper, news service, or similar entity engaged in the on-the-spot broadcasting of news events 11 concerning those persons, scenes or occurrences which are in 12 the news and of general public interest, including sporting 13 14 events. B. Private/Family Use. The filming or video taping of motion 15 pictures solely for private/family use. 16 C. Charitable Films and Student Films. Projects produced by a 17 nonprofit organization that is registered with the Department 18 of Revenue and Taxation or the Internal Revenue Service as 19 20 a charitable organization or produced by a student(s) of an educational institution. 21 D. Small Crews. If the crew does not exceed five persons and 22 there is no extensive use of props, equipment, cast or other 23 participants, the small crew shall be exempt if the following 24 conditions are met: 25 The crew is filming a parade, demonstration or other 26 1. special event and has obtained all permission that may 27

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1	be required. The exemption shall allow them to operate
2	on the same basis as a citizen with a camera; or
3	2. Pedestrian and vehicular traffic is not altered; and
4	3. No special parking provisions are included; and
5	4. No stunt work is performed; and
6	5. Permission is obtained from controlling authorities
7	to use Government of Guam property, other than
8	sidewalks and streets; and
9	6. Permission is obtained from owners to use private
10	property where applicable.
11	§50408. Local Production Companies Exempt. In addition to the General
12	Exemptions authorized in §50407 of this act, the provisions of this Article
13	and the rules, regulations, and requirements authorized herein shall not
14	apply to or affect local production companies if:
15	1. The production company was incorporated in Guam.
16	2. Principal owner(s) is a resident of Guam and has
17	filed individual tax returns in Guam for a period of
18	at least three (3) years.
19	3. The production company maintains its headquarters
20	in Guam.
21	4. The production company is licensed to do business
22	in Guam.
23	5. The daily operations of the production company are
24	managed by a resident of Guam.
25	§50409. Applicants and Issuance.
26	a) Issuing Authority. The issuing authority shall be the Guam Film
27	Office Administrator.

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b) Applications. Each application for filming under this chapter must 1 be completed in full and filed with the Administrator or his/her designee 2 c) The permit application *shall* be in a form the Administrator 3 4 or his/her designee may reasonably require. In lieu of the foregoing, the applicant may submit the permit application on the form adopted and in 5 use by the Guam Film Office. 6 d) The Administrator or his/her designee may refer the application to 7 such appropriate government department, agency, autonomous agency, 8 office or instrumentality as are directly impacted by the application and 9 as he/she deems necessary from the nature of the application for review, 10 evaluation, investigation and recommendations by the department, 11 agency, autonomous agency, office or instrumentality regarding 12 approval or disapproval of the application. 13 e) The Administrator or his/her designee *shall* issue a permit under this 14 chapter if it is determined that the following criteria have been met: 15 1. The proposed use will not unreasonably interfere with or 16 endanger the public peace or rights of nearby residents to 17 the quiet, peaceable enjoyment of their property, or 18 otherwise be detrimental to the public peace, health, safety 19 or general welfare; 20 2. The proposed use will not unduly impede, obstruct or 21 interfere with the operation of emergency vehicles or 22 equipment in or through the permit area, or adversely affect 23 the government's ability to perform municipal functions or 24 furnish government services in the vicinity of the permitted 25 area; and 26

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13. The proposed use will not constitute a fire or safety hazard2and all proper safety precautions will be taken as is3reasonably necessary to protect the public peace, health,4safety or general welfare.

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5 f) The Administrator or his/her designee *shall* deny the permit if the 6 conditions of this chapter and all applicable laws and regulations have 7 not been met or if the application contains incomplete or false 8 information. No permit *shall* be denied without a clear written 9 explanation of the reasons compelling a denial and the process by which 10 said denial may be appealed.

11 g) The Administrator or his/her designee may immediately revoke or 12 suspend a permit which has been granted, if the conditions of this 13 chapter and all applicable laws and regulations are no longer being met, 14 if the information supplied by the applicant becomes, or is determined to 15 be, false or incomplete, or if any substantial change in circumstances 16 results in the proposed use becoming detrimental to the public peace, 17 health, safety or general welfare.

h) The Guam Economic Development Authority Compliance and Audit
Department *shall* conduct production site inspections and monitoring.

i) Reimbursement for Personnel. The production company *shall*reimburse the Government of Guam for any personnel provided to the
company, (i.e. police, fire, traffic control, medical personnel) for the
purpose of assisting the production. Any cost *shall* be negotiated, and
approved, prior to shoot date. A fee for issuance of the permit *shall* be
set by the advisory committee.

26 §50410. Indemnification of Government Against Liability.

a) Prior and as a condition precedent to the granting of a permit under 1 this chapter, each applicant *shall* agree to indemnify, defend and hold 2 the Government of Guam, its authorized agents, officers, representatives 3 and employees harmless form and against any and all losses, damages 4 claims, causes of action, costs, liabilities, penalties, judgments and 5 expenses, including without limitation, defense costs and reasonable 6 legal fees, resulting from any and all claims or damage of any nature, 7 including any accident, loss or damage to persons or property which the 8 government may incur and which arise from or relate to any activity 9 conducted by the permittee or any of its agents, employees, 10 representatives, contractors or consultants in connection with the rights 11 granted in the permit or under this chapter. The form of the 12 indemnification agreement *shall* be as determined by the Attorney 13 General of Guam. 14

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§50411. Insurance and Bonding Required.

(a) Liability Insurance. As a condition of issuance of a permit 16 hereunder, every permittee must procure and maintain in full force and 17 effect during the term of the permit a policy (or policies) of insurance 18 from an insurance company licensed to do business in Guam naming the 19 Government of Guam, it's officers, employees and agents as coinsured 20 for protection against claims of third persons for any and all liability of 21 permitteee with respect to its obligations and liabilities under its permit 22 and this chapter and its indemnities, including, but not limited to, 23 commercial general liability insurance on an "occurrence" basis against 24 claims for personal injury, including death, bodily injury or property 25 damage liability, and in an amount no less than one million dollars 26 (\$1,000,000.00), and which otherwise provides sufficient coverage that 27

1the Administrator or his/her designee determines to be necessary and2adequate under the circumstances. The certificate *shall* not be subject to3cancellation or modification until after thirty days' written notice to the4Guam Film Office. Prior to issuance of any permit, a copy of the5certificate of insurance *shall* be provided to the Insurance6Commissioner. A copy of the certificate will remain on permanent file.7(b) Worker's Compensation Insurance. An applicant *shall* conform to

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8 all applicable federal and local requirements for worker's compensation
9 insurance for all persons operating under a permit.

10(c) Hold Harmless Agreement. An applicant shall execute a hold11harmless agreement as provided by the Government of Guam and12incorporated within the permit issued under this chapter.

(d) Faithful Performance Bond. To ensure cleanup and restoration of 13 any public property involved in the filming, the permittee may be 14 required to post a refundable Faithful Performance Bond (amount to be 15 16 determined by Rules and Regulations), cash surety or other comparable form of security guarantee at the time application is submitted. Upon 17 completion of filming, cleanup and restoration and a satisfactory 18 inspection of the site by Guam Film Office Administrator or his/her 19 designee, the bond may be returned to applicant. 20

§50412. Effective Date. This Article *shall* be effective 180 days after the date of enactment.

§50413. Severability. *If* any provision of this law or its application to any

- 24 person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such
- 25 invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this law, which

can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to
 this end the provisions of this law are severable."
