## AN ACT TO AMEND §34105, §34106, 10 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, CHAPTER 34 RELATIVE TO PET LICENSE ISSUANCE.

1	Section 1. Legislative findings and intent. I Mina' trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan
2	finds that enforcement of the statutes relating to pet licensing are important to protect the health
3	and well-being of Guam residents and pets. The public interest would best be served by
4	allowing the Department of Agriculture to enter into a private-public partnership wherein a
5	private non-profit organization could assume the issuance of pet licenses. A partnership with a
6	non-profit organization which is already contracted to operate the government of Guam impound
7	facility would promote compliance with the law, facilitate the return of lost pets, and assist in
8	raising funds to operate the animal shelter.
9	Section 2. Chapter 34, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, Section §34105 is amended
10	as follows
11	"§34105. Pet License Issuance and Description
12	(a) All licenses for pets shall be issued by the Department of Agriculture. Upon payment
13	of a fee, which shall be no less than \$10 per year per pet. The license shall be in such form as
14	the Director shall approve and shall include the following:
15	(1) The name and address of the owner;
16	(2) The expiration date of the license;
17	(3) The date of payment;
18	(4) The breed, age, sex, sterilization status (whether spayed or neutered) and color
19	of the pet;

- 20 (5) The serial number of the tag issued for such pet; (6) The date of rabies vaccination, vaccine expiration date, the type, 21 manufacturer's name and serial number of the vaccine lot used. 22 23 (b) The Director may contract the operation of the pet licensing program to the same 24 gualified non-profit private organization, if any, which the Director has contracted to operate the pet impound facility pursuant to § 34118. If the Director so contracts, the 25 private non-profit organization must operate the pet licensing program so as to conform 26 27 to the provisions provided herein. The contract shall provide that the non-profit private 28 organization retain all the monies collected from the issuance of pet licenses and that all such monies be applied first to the operation of the pet licensing program and second to 29
- 30 the operation of the pet impound facility.

Section 3. Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 34, Section 34106 is amended as
follows:

33 "§ 34106. Description of the Pet License Tag.

Every pet license tag must display a serial number and the license year. Any rabies tag 34 35 issued by a veterinarian at the time the pet is vaccinated against rabies can serve as the pet 36 license tag as well, as long as the rabies tag displays a serial number and license year. The tag shall be attached to a collar around the neck of or to a harness worn by the pet for which the 37 license tag was issued, except when the pet is displayed in an exhibition or show. It shall be 38 39 unlawful for any person to attach a license tag to the collar or harness of any pet except the pet 40 which is described in the application for such license." Section 3. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon enactment. 41

42 Section 4: Severability. If any provision of this law or its application to any person or 43 circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other 44 provisions or applications of this law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or 45 applications, and to this end the provisions of this law are severable.
