AN ACT TO SUPPORT WOMEN AND SAVE CHILDREN, BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER 94 TO TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, WHICH MAY BE CITED AS THE ACTO PARA MA SAPOTTE I FAMA'LAO'AN YAN PARA MA SATBA I FAMAGU'ON.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that much 2 attention is given to ending abortion or keeping it legal. I Liheslaturan Guåhan 3 finds that more must be done to reduce the abortion rate by helping and supporting 4 pregnant women. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that preventing pregnancy 5 is an important part of reducing the abortion rate in Guam. While prevention of 6 unintended or unwanted pregnancy should remain a goal, unintended or unwanted 7 pregnancies will happen. Women who do become pregnant and wish to carry their 8 child to term need the support to achieve this so that abortion is not their only 9 option. 10

1	Finally, I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that programs are needed to protect		
2	infants who have been born but subsequently after birth become victims of		
3	desperation and abandonment.

25	I Måga 'lahen Guåhan is hereby authorized to establish a public, not-for-		
26	profit corporation to be called the Foundation to Para'ma Sapotte Fama'lao'an yan		
27	para u Satba i Fa	magu'on ("Foundation") that shall be separate and apart from the	

government of Guam for the purposes of supporting the health of expectant
 mothers and newborns and reducing the number of abortions performed on Guam.

3 §94102. Foundation Para'ma Sapotte Fama'lao'an yan para u Satba i 4 Famagu'on Fund.

The Foundation *shall* be able to accept private gifts, donations, endowments, 5 services in-kind, grants and other money which may be offered in support of the 6 Foundation. All such private gifts, donations, endowments, services in-kind, 7 grants and other money *shall* be in accordance with the laws of Guam and subject 8 to reasonable conditions. Such funds as are received *shall* be deposited into a fund 9 as established by the Foundation and known as the Sapotte Fama'lao'an yan para u 10 Satba i Famagu'on ("Fund"). Expenditures shall be made from the Fund in 11 accordance with such conditions as may be attached to appropriations, private 12 gifts, donations, endowments, services in-kind and grants. The Public Auditor 13 shall audit the Fund periodically or as warranted. 14

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§94103. Board of Directors.

The Foundation, shall be comprised of a nine- (9-) member Board of 16 17 Directors. I Måga'lahen shall appoint the Directors of said corporation and each Director will serve an initial term of one (1) year. I Måga'lahen shall serve as 18 temporary chairperson, and shall convene the first meeting of the Foundation. At 19 its first meeting the Foundation *shall* elect from among its members its officers, 20 including an Executive Director, and *shall* establish in its articles of incorporation 21 and by-laws the manner of appointment and length of service for Directors and all 22 other rules and regulations relative to operations, investments and programs funded 23 24 through private gifts, donations, endowments, services in-kind, grants and other money. In the event of a vacancy on the Board of Directors, I Måga'lahen shall 25 appoint a replacement for the unexpired term. 26

27 §94104. Foundation Information Published on Website.

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1 The Foundation *shall* establish a website and publish current information 2 regarding its activities on the website on a monthly basis. The information may 3 include, but not be limited to, planned events and activities, financial statements, 4 meeting minutes and agendas, and any other information that the Foundation may 5 deem beneficial to the general public.

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§94105. Reporting Information.

The Foundation *shall* transmit quarterly reports detailing information
pertaining to the contributions made to and expenditures from the Foundation Fund
to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and to the Office of the Public Auditor of Guam, all of
which *shall* be made available on the Foundation's website.

- 4 (a) *Child* shall mean an infant thirty (30) days or younger.
- (b) *Medical Provider* shall mean a physician or nurse licensed to practice on
 Guam, or a medical clinic or hospital on Guam.
- 7 (c) *Law enforcement* shall mean an officer of or one of the following
 8 agencies: the Guam Police Department, the Guam Fire Department, the Child
 9 Protective Services Division of DPHSS.
- 10 §94302. Surrender of Child to a Public Medical Provider or Public
 11 Law Enforcement Agency (Safe Haven Provider).
- A parent or a person designated by the parent may surrender permanent custody and care of a child to a public medical provider or public law enforcement agency by physically leaving the child with or delivering the child to the medical provider or law enforcement officer or agency.
- 16 §94303. Responsibilities of the Safe Haven Provider (SHP).
- Any SHP shall, without a court order, take possession of a child who is 17 thirty (30) days old or younger if the child is left with or voluntarily delivered to an 18 SHP by the child's parent or person designated by the parent who does not express 19 intent to return for the child. A SHP that takes possession of a child shall perform 20 21 any act necessary to protect the physical health and safety of the child. Upon delivery of the child, the law enforcement agency or medical provider employee 22 shall take the child into protective custody for seventy (72) hours and immediately 23 notify the Division of Child Protective Services of the Department of Public Health 24 and Social Services. 25

26 **§94304.** Immunity for the Provider.

A medical provider or law enforcement agency *shall* incur no civil or
 criminal liability for any good faith acts or omissions performed pursuant to this
 Act.

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§94305. Protection for Surrendering Parent.

5 The fact that a parent voluntarily delivered a child to and left the child with, 6 or voluntarily arranged for another person to deliver a child to and leave the child 7 with, a medical provider or law enforcement agency serves as an affirmative 8 defense to a prosecution for endangering the child. This section specifically does 9 not constitute a defense to any prosecution arising from an act of abuse or neglect 10 committed prior to the delivery of a child to a medical provider or law enforcement 11 agency.

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§94306. Effect on Parental Rights.

The Division of Child Protective Services of the Department of Public Health and Social Services shall file a petition for termination of parental rights within ten days of receiving the child, and initiate a dependency action to place the child in a permanent home."

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Section 2. Abortion Report.

18 A new item (25) is hereby *added* to subsection (a) of §3218 of Article 2,

19 Chapter 3, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"(25) Reason(s) the mother intends to abort the pregnancy described in a
manner that conceals the identity of the patient."

22 Section 3. Notice of Alternatives to Abortion Required.

A new §4402.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 4A of Division 1 of Title 19,

24 Guam Code Annotated, to read:

25 "§4402.1. Except in the case of a medical emergency, no person shall
26 perform an abortion upon a pregnant woman unless he or she first obtains a written

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statement from the woman, that she has been made aware that adoption or
 placement in the "Safe Haven" program is an alternative to abortion."

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Section 4. Appropriation.

Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is hereby appropriated from
the Fiscal Year 2012 Healthy Futures Fund to the Foundation *para 'ma Sapotte Fama'lao'an yan para 'ma u Satba i Famagu'on*, effective October 1, 2012.

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Section 5. Severability.

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8 If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance 9 is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other 10 provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid 11 provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
