AN ACT TO ADD NEW §7103(g) OF CHAPTER 7, TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EXEMPTING FROM VEHICLE REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS CERTAIN MOTORIZED UTILITY VEHICLES OPERATED BY GUAM MAYORS IN ACCORDANCE WITH, AND IN FURTHERANCE OF, THEIR STATUTORILY PRESCRIBED DUTY TO OVERSEE, COORDINATE AND OTHERWISE UNDERTAKE THE BEAUTIFICATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THEIR VILLAGES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds

3 that pursuant to §§40112-40113 of Division 4, Chapter 40, Title 5, Guam Code

Annotated, Guam Mayors are responsible for general minor repair and

maintenance work including but not limited to cleaning, painting, plumbing,

planting, collecting and transporting trash and debris, and other similar tasks

incident to the general upkeep, beautification and maintenance of their respective

villages.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that in performing these duties, the

10 Mayors and/or their respective staff regularly operate certain motorized utility

vehicles such as multifunctional utility/logistics and equipment vehicles ("mules"),

12 gator recreational utility vehicles ("gators"), and riding mowers.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that while the Mayors' operation of these vehicles is primarily limited to the shoulders of public roadways, I Liheslatura recognizes that said operation involves moving onto the travelled portion of public roadways on certain occasions such as where passage on the shoulder of a road is impossible or otherwise unsafe. Therefore, I Liheslaturan Guåhan deems it in the public interest that the village Mayors be able to operate these vehicles upon public roadways under certain circumstances, and, toward this end, that said vehicles, when operated as prescribed by this Act, be exempted from the requirements of Guam's vehicle registration law.

**Section 2.** Section 7103 of Chapter 7, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* by *adding* new subsection (g) to exempt from vehicle registration requirements certain motorized utility vehicles operated by village Mayors under certain conditions:

"(g) Operating a "motorized utility vehicle" in accordance with, and in furtherance of, legitimate Mayoral duties. Mayors, Vice-Mayors, and/or their respective staff may operate unregistered motorized utility vehicles such as mules, gators, golf carts, and riding mowers on public roadways where (1) passage on the shoulder of a roadway is impossible or otherwise unsafe, and (2) the operator of said vehicle is engaged in the performance of Mayoral duties prescribed by 5 GCA \$40101 et seq., and is otherwise acting in accordance with Guam law. For purposes of this section, a "motorized utility vehicle" is any motorized vehicle primarily manufactured for offroadway use, which is sixty-three inches (63") or less in width, has an unladen dry weight of one thousand eight hundred fifty pounds (1,850 lbs) or less, and travels on less than six (6) wheels.

**Section 3. Effective Date.** This provisions contained herein shall take effect immediately upon enactment of this Act.
