**AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1(x)(2), CHAPTER V OF PUBLIC
LAW 32-181, RELATIVE TO APPROPRIATING ADDITIONAL
FUNDS FOR EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES, AND CAPITAL OUTLAY
FOR THE GUAM MUSEUM.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 1(x)(2), Chapter V of Public Law 32-181 is hereby amended to read:

“(2) Appropriation to the Guam Museum Fund. The sum of Five Hundred Fifty Two Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Seven Dollars **(\$552,257)** shall be allocated from the Tourist Attraction Fund appropriation in Subsection (x)(1) to the Guam Museum Fund for the sole purpose of funding the Guam Museum operations pursuant to § 87136(h), Chapter 87, Title 5 GCA and the sum of Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000) shall be transferred from the Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) Surplus Fund to the Guam Museum Fund and is hereby appropriated from the Guam Museum Fund to the Department of Chamorro Affairs for the sole purpose of funding Guam Museum equipment, supplies, and capital outlay expenditures. Notwithstanding the general provisions of §30107.1 of Chapter 30 of Title 11 GCA and this Act, this allocation in this Subsections shall continue to be available until expended and is not subject to transfer or use for any other purpose. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the appropriation from the Guam Museum Fund to the Department of Chamorro Affairs in this

1 Subsections shall continue to be available until expended and is not subject to
2 transfer or use for any other purpose.”

3 **Section 2. Effective Date.** This Act *shall* become effective upon enactment.

4 **Section 3. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Act or its application to any
5 person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity *shall not* affect other
6 provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid
7 provision or application and to this end the provisions of this Act is severable.
