AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9(c) OF PUBLIC LAW 32-054, REQUIRING THAT RELATIVE TO THE NATIONAL CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELOR EXAM IS THE SOLE REQUISITE EXAM FOR LICENSURE FOR LICENSED COUNSELOR; MENTAL HEALTH AND TO AMEND SECTIONS 1, 2, 8, 9 AND 16 OF P.L. 32-054 FOR PURPOSES **OF ESTABLISHING A LICENSED INTERN DESIGNATION DURING THE THREE THOUSAND (3,000) HOUR POST-GRADUATE CLINICAL EXPERIENCE PERIOD REQUIRED** FOR MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Finding and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 2 that the requisite examination for licensure as a Licensed Mental Health Counselor 3 (LMHC) may be appropriately accomplished with the National Clinical Mental 4 Health Counselor Exam (NCMHCE) which is the "specialty license" for those 5 specializing in mental health counseling. Further, that the National Counselor 6 7 Examination (NCE) is a basic entry examination for the generalist license into the profession of Licensed Professional Counselor (LCE). According to the National 8 Board of Certified Counselors (NBCC) the taking of both exams is usually not 9 required in most states, unless the applicant is seeking national certification and 10 licensure which would be 'portable' to most states, but still subject to any additional 11 requirement(s) a state may mandate. 12

The Association of the Individual, Marriage and Family Therapists of Guam
 is requesting that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* amend the requirement for both exams for

Licensed Mental Health Counselor, and that only the NCMHCE be required, but
 not the NCE.

3 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that there is an appropriate need to establish an Intern license designation for a qualified person pursuing an education and career 4 as an Individual, Marriage and Family Therapist (IMFT), Certified Professional 5 Counselor (CPC), Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), Licensed Mental 6 Health Counselor (LMHC), Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC), or Marriage 7 and Family Therapist (MFT). This limited license designation as a mental 8 healthcare intern would only be applicable during the post-graduate period and the 9 accumulation of the requisite three thousand (3,000) hours of clinical experience, 10 and would allow for billable hours for services rendered during this period. 11

12 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that notwithstanding the passage and enactment of P.L. 32-054 (July 05, 2013), that the existing provisions pursuant to 13 Article 13 Individual, Marriage and Family Therapy (P.L. 24-329 – Aug. 14, 1998) 14 15 were not repealed. This has created a dilemma for the Compiler of Laws who has not, to date, codified the provisions of P.L. 32-054. It is the intent of I 16 Liheslaturan Guåhan to rectify this situation by repealing §§ 121301 et seq. 17 121305 of Article 13, and reenact Article 13 with P.L. 32-054, as amended 18 pursuant to this Act. 19

Section 2. Subsection 9(c) of Public Law 32-054, is amended to read:

"(c) Individuals who hold a current, valid license in a state of the United
States, its territories or a foreign country approved by the Board on a case-by-case
basis as a Licensed Clinical Counselor of Mental Health, Licensed Clinical Mental
Health Counselor, Licensed Mental Health Counselor, Licensed Mental Health
Practitioner, Licensed Professional Counselor of Mental Health, or other license

deemed by the Board to be substantially equivalent to the Guam License for
Licensed Mental Health Counselor, and who has passed both the NCE and the
<u>National Clinical Mental Health Counselor Exam (NCMHCE)</u> in a manner
approved by the <u>National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC)</u> shall be eligible
for the Guam license for a Licensed Mental Health Counselor."

Section 3. A new Subsection (j) is hereby added to Section 1 of P.L. 32054, to read:

"(j) A Licensed Mental Health Intern designation shall mean a person who 8 9 is seeking licensure and is acquiring the three thousand (3,000) hours of postgraduate clinical experience in accordance with this Article for purposes of 10 acquiring and ultimately meeting the requisite requirements for full licensure as an 11 Individual, Marriage and Family Therapist (IMFT), Certified Professional 12 Counselor (CPC), Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), Licensed Mental 13 Health Counselor (LMHC), Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC), Marriage and 14 Family Therapist (MFT), or other Mental Health Professional, as a Licensed 15 Mental Health Professional. To be legible for the intern license, the applicant shall 16 have completed all of the other criteria required for qualification for his or her 17 respective field for licensure pursuant to (a)(1) of Section 2, Section 8, Section 9 or 18 Section 16, respectively, of this Article." 19

Section 4. A new Subsection (d) is hereby added to Section 2 of P.L. 32054, to read:

"(d) The Board *shall* issue a 'Professional Counselor Intern License' and number to an applicant who has satisfied all of the applicable requisite provisions of qualifications for licensure pursuant to (a)(1) of this Section, and who is

1	acquiring the three thousand (3,000) hours of post-graduate clinical experience
2	required for licensure, as provided pursuant to $(a)(2)$ of this Section.
3	(1) The Board shall provide the application form to be completed by (1)
4	an applicant for a Mental Health Intern License."
5	Section 5. A new Subsection (d) is hereby added to Section 8 of P.L. 32-
6	054, to read:
7	"(d) The Board shall issue a 'Mental Health Counselor Intern License' and
8	number to an applicant who has satisfied all of the applicable requisite provisions
9	of qualifications for licensure pursuant to (a)(1) of this Section, and who is
10	acquiring the three thousand (3,000) hours of post-graduate clinical experience
11	required for licensure, as provided pursuant to (a)(2) of this Section.
12	(1) The Board shall provide the application form to be completed
13	by an applicant for a Mental Health Intern License."
14	Section 5.
15	Section 6. A new Subsection (d) is hereby added to Section 9 of P.L. 32-
16	054, to read:
17	"(d) The Board shall issue a 'Mental Health Intern License' and number to
18	an applicant who has satisfied all of the applicable requisite provisions of
19	qualifications for licensure pursuant to (a)(1) of this Section, and who is acquiring
20	the three thousand (3,000) hours of post-graduate clinical experience required for
21	licensure, as provided pursuant to (a)(2) of this Section."
22	(1) The Board shall provide the application form to be completed
23	by an applicant for a Mental Health Intern License."

Section 7. A new Subsection (d) is hereby added to Section 16 of P.L. 32 054, to read:

"(d) The Board shall issue a 'Marriage and Family Therapist Intern License'
and number to an applicant who has satisfied all of the applicable requisite
provisions of qualifications for licensure pursuant to (a)(1) of this Section, and who
is acquiring the three thousand (3,000) hours of post-graduate clinical experience
required for licensure, as provided pursuant to (a)(2) of this Section.

8 (1) The Board shall provide the application form to be completed
9 by an applicant for a Mental Health Intern License."

Section 8. The following §§ 121301 et seq. 121305 of Article 13, Chapter
12, Part 2, Division 1 of 10 GCA, as provided pursuant to P.L. 24-329:6 (Aug. 14,
12 1998), are hereby repealed.

Section 9. The Compiler of Laws shall appropriately codify P.L. 32-054, as
 amended pursuant to this Act, under Article 13 of Chapter 12, Part 2, Division 1 of
 10 GCA.

16 Section 10. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to 17 any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such 18 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be 19 given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the 20 provisions of this Act are severable.
