AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 38 TO CHAPTER XII OF PUBLIC LAW 33-66; RELATIVE TO THE TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT OF RETIRED CONSERVATION **OFFICERS WITHIN THE DIVISION OF AQUATIC** AND WILDLIFE RESOURCES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE SHOULD A CRITICAL NEED ARISE DUE TO MILITARY ACTIVATION OR LONG-TERM DISABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 1 that Conservation Officers within the Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources 2 (DAWR) of the Department of Agriculture, like many other Peace Officers, are 3 service-minded individuals who often serve their country as reservists in our 4 nation's military reserve programs and/or the Guam National Guard. 5 The activation and deployment of these military forces have an impact on the 6 7 performance of the DAWR where adequate replacements are unavailable. Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to allow the Chief 8

9 Conservation Officer to temporarily employ retired Conservation Officers in order 10 to meet the needs of the DAWR.

Section 2. A new Section 38, as set forth below, is hereby *added* to Chapter
XII of Public Law 33-66:

3	"Section 38. Temporary Employment of Retired Guam
4	Conservation Officers. The Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources
5	(DAWR) of the Department of Agriculture may hire retired Conservation
6	Officers if a critical need arises because of military activation of
7	Conservation Officers or absence due to a long-term disability status, which
8	has been certified by a medical doctor. The DAWR may exercise this hiring
9	authority provided its authorized budget for personnel is not exceeded. The
10	retiree hired shall fill such a temporarily vacant position and shall be
11	terminated when the incumbent returns from military service or long-term
12	disability. Retired officers may be hired only at the ranks of Conservation
13	Officer I and below, only at Step I, and shall not receive sick and annual
14	leave. Conservation Officers hired under this section shall first meet the
15	requirements of the position in question, except for written examinations,
16	and the Chief Conservation Officer shall certify that every retiree hired is fit
	for duty. Notwithstanding § 8121(a), Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, retirees
18	hired temporarily pursuant to this Section may continue to receive retirement
19	benefits. Any employee hired under this Section shall only be eligible to
20	enroll in the Government of Guam Health Insurance Program as an active

1	employee. The Director of the Department of Agriculture shall report to I
2	Liheslaturan Guåhan on July 1, 2016, and again thirty (30) days after the
3	end of the fiscal year, of the number of retired Conservation Officers hired
4	pursuant to this Section, the positions filled, the length of employment, the
5	cost of said hiring, and the nature of the critical need that was filled."
