AN ACT TO AMEND §40112(m), CHAPTER 40, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND ADD A NEW §40112(t) AND §40112(u), CHAPTER 40, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED. RELATIVE TO **AUTHORIZING** MAYORS TO OFFER VETERAN STATUS DATA ON VERFICATION OF RESIDENCY FORMS, INCLUDE THE SOLICITATION OF VETERAN DEMOGRAPHICS IN THEIR ANNUAL CENSUS AND CONDUCT SEMI-ANNUAL COMMUNITY OUTREACH EFFORTS TO VERIFY THE VETERAN POPULATION IN THEIR JURISDICTIONS FOR THE PURPOSE OF UPDATING THE GUAM VETERAN REGISTRY AND CONNECTING THE GUAM VETERAN POPULATION TO AVAILABLE SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.

I Liheslatura Guåhan finds that since the enactment of P.L. 32-101 in 3

November 2013, the Office of Veterans Affairs has been responsible for the 4

establishment and maintenance of a Guam Veterans Registry.

6 I Liheslatura Guåhan finds that the established number of veterans on the

registry directly influences the level of services and benefits afforded to Guam

veterans by the U.S. Federal Government. P.L. 32-101 authorizes the Office of

9 Veterans Affairs to use data collected at other government agencies which may be

1	"collecting the data in whole or in part" and allows that all other government			
2	agencies "whenever applicable, shall render assistance" to the Office of Veterans			
3	Affairs in implementing its provisions.			
4	In furtherance of the current efforts of the Office of Veterans Affairs and			
5	other agencies, it is the intent of I Liheslatura Guåhan to authorize village mayors			
6	to include the solicitation of veteran data in their annual census, offer the option of			
7	listing veteran status on a constituents verification of residency form and conduc			
8	semi-annual community outreach to the veteran population of his/her jurisdiction			
9	for the purpose of updating the Guam Veterans Registry and connecting the			
10	veteran population to available services.			
11	Section 2. §40112(m), Chapter 40, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated is hereby			
12	amended to read:			
13	"§40112. Powers, Duties and Responsibilities.			
14	A Mayor shall perform the following duties and responsibilities			
15	in his district:			
16	(m) Conduct an annual census and maintain a current listing of			
17	names of all residents in his jurisdiction. As part of the process of			
18	conducting the annual census, verify veteran status of resident, if any,			
19	and submit a separate annual report of the names and total number of			
20	veterans residing in his/her jurisdiction to the Office of Veterans			
21	Affairs for the purpose of updating the Guam Veteran Registry."			
22	Section 3. A new §40112(t) & §40112(u) are hereby added to Chapter 40,			
23	Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:			
24	"§40112. Powers, Duties and Responsibilities.			
25	A Mayor shall perform the following duties and responsibilities			
26	in his district:			

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(t) Solicit veteran status (if any) of constituents applying for a verification of residency and offer the option of listing veteran status on the verification of residency form, upon presentation of a DD214 form. Transmit a copy of the DD214 form and Verification of Residency form to the Office of Veterans Affairs no later than five (5) business days after the date of residency verification for the purpose of updating the Guam Veterans Registry and connecting veterans to available services. Transmission of forms may be made by electronic means as prescribed by the Office of Veterans Affairs. The Office of Veteran Affairs shall have the authority to adopt regulations to implement and administer the provisions of this Section.

(u) Conduct semi-annual community outreach within his/her jurisdiction for the purpose of updating the Guam Veterans Registry at the Office of Veterans Affairs and connecting veterans and their families to available services."
