AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW § 55.40 TO CHAPTER 55, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE CRIMINALIZATION OF DISARMING OF PEACE OFFICERS.



## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that no Guam law currently exists in regards to the disarming of peace officers. The disarming of peace officers is found to be a felony in other states throughout the nation. The disarming of peace officers is classified as a felony as it results in the inability of a peace officer to properly execute their duties to protect the public.

I Liheslatura further finds that the disarming of a peace officer typically elicits a response from the peace officer to retrieve the weapon from the disarming individual in order to continue properly executing his or her duties. Such a response, when warranted, could result in the harm of the concerned individuals, or those in surrounding areas. Techniques of these nature are practiced in a controlled environment, in order to ensure the safety of all those involved and to mitigate risk in the community. The retrieval of the weapon by the peace officer also ensures that the weapon is not used to harm others by the disarming individual.

I Liheslatura further finds that there may be some misunderstandings in the community about disarming a peace officer as no law currently exists and so I Liheslatura seeks to define what disarming a peace officer entails and to provide for the appropriate punishment when necessary.

1	Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to criminalize the
2	disarming of peace officers in order to create a better community understanding of
3	its harm and to better ensure the safety of the People of Guam.
4	Section 2. A new § 55.40 is hereby added to Chapter 55, Title 9, Guam
5	Code Annotated, to read:
6	"§ 55.40. Disarming of a Peace Officer; Defined & Punished.
7	(a) A person commits the crime of disarming a peace officer, as defined by §
8	51101 of Chapter 51, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, if such person
9	intentionally:
10	(1) Removes, or attempts to remove, a firearm, deadly weapon, or less-
11	lethal weapon, including any blunt impact, chemical, or conducted
12	energy device, used in the performance of his or her official duties from
13	the person of a peace officer while such officer is acting within the
14	scope of his or her official duties; or
15	(2) Deprives, or attempts to deprive, a peace officer of such officer's
16	use of a firearm, deadly weapon, or any other equipment described in
17	subsection (1) of this section while the officer is acting within the scope
18	of his or her official duties.
19	(b) The provisions of this section shall not apply when:
20	(1) The defendant does not know or could not reasonably have known
21	that the person he or she disarmed was a peace officer; or
22	(2) The peace officer was engaged in an incident involving felonious
23	conduct by the peace officer at the time the defendant disarmed such
24	officer.
25	(c) An offense under this Section is a felony of the third degree, unless the
26	defendant's intent is to injure anyone, in which case the offense is a felony of
27	the second degree."
