AN ACT TO AMEND § 9102 OF CHAPTER 9 OF TITLE 7 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CLARIFYING EXEMPTIONS OF THE GUAM BAR, AS A PUBLIC BODY CORPORATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that Guam law creating the Bar of Guam, now known as the Guam Bar Association, is governed by the Supreme Court of Guam pursuant to P.L. 21-147 (7 GCA. § 9104).

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the status of the Guam Bar Association described as a "public body corporate" may cause significant confusion for the public and for the members of the association as to its obligations to comply with Guam laws imposed upon Government of Guam entities and officials.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that 7 GCA §9102 and 7 GCA § 9A102 refer to the Guam Bar Association as a "public body corporate." Additionally, the commentary to Chapter 9A of Title 7 of the Guam Code Annotated provides the following:

"COMMENT: Pursuant to P.L. 21-147 (7 GCA § 9104) the power to govern attorneys and the Bar of Guam is not transferred

to the Supreme Court of Guam until that court not only is operating, but also has adopted its own rules for the governance of attorneys. Until that time, the following Chapter continues in effect. As noted above, this Chapter was meant to be replaced by Supreme Court of Guam rules. On May 17, 1996, the Supreme Court by promulgation order adopted the existing rules governing admission and rules of discipline as its interim rules. (In re: James S. Brooks, Supreme Court Case No. ADC 03-002 (Order, July 19, 2005)). There, the Supreme Court stated:

The [Supreme] court explicitly continued the rules then in effect as the rules governing the admission in this jurisdiction. The provisions of the Integrated Bar Act, including Title 7 GCA § 9113, were in effect at that time and therefore continued to remain in effect after the court's adoption of the interim rules. The court has subsequently amended the Rules Governing Admission to the Practice of Law and the Rules for the Discipline of Attorneys on numerous occasions but has not by order repealed all the other rules of admission and discipline previously in effect."

§ 9102 of Chapter 9, Title 7, Guam Code Annotated further provides that if the Guam Bar Association continues as an integrated bar association, then it shall continue as a "public body corporate."

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the members of the Bar of Guam are not public officials, nor do they administer or receive any public appropriation for the management and maintenance of their association.

1	Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to clarify the
2	obligations of the Bar of Guam aka Guam Bar Association, as a public body
3	corporate, for the purpose of defining applicable laws to the Guam Bar Association
4	for and in the best interests of both the public and the members of the association.
5	Section 2. § 9102(a) of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:
6	"(a) The Supreme Court of Guam may continue, by rule, the
7	requirement contained in this section, that no person is authorized to practice law
8	onin Guam, unless that person be a member in good standing of an integrated bar
9	association. If such requirement is continued, then the Bar of Guam is a public body
10	corporate, the membership of which consists of persons who are now or hereafter
11	licensed to practice law onin Guam. However, the Bar of Guam shall be exempt
12	from the requirements of the following:
13	(i) Title 4, Guam Code Annotated: Public Officers & Employees
14	(ii) Title 5, Guam Code Annotated: Government Operations."
