AN ACT TO AMEND ITEM (I) OF § 6101 OF ARTICLE 1, § 6302 OF ARTICLE 3, AND SECTIONS UNDER ARTICLE 4, ALL OF CHAPTER 6, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; RELATIVE TO CLARIFYING THE DEFINITION OF ELECTRONIC CIGARETTES, RAISING THE MINIMUM AGE OF LEGAL ACCESS TO TOBACCO PRODUCTS AND ELECTRONIC CIGARETTES TO TWENTY-ONE (21) YEARS, AND CITING THIS ACT AS "YOUTH PROTECTION ACT OF 2017".

Section 1. Clarification of Definition of Electronic Cigarettes Relative to

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Prohibition Sale or Distribution of Tobacco Products to Persons Under 3 Twenty-One (21) Years of Age. Item (1) of § 6101 (Definitions), Article 1, 4 Chapter 6, Title 11 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read: 5 "(1) Electronic cigarettes, also known as e-cigarettes, are batteryoperated products designed to deliver nicotine, flavor and other chemicals. 6 They turn nicotine, which is highly addictive, and other chemicals into a 7 vapor that is inhaled by the user. For the purposes of this Chapter, and the 8 9 prohibition pertaining solely to a person under the minimum age of legal access pursuant to §§ 6400 and 6405, tobacco products shall also be deemed 10 11 to include and *shall* be similarly applicable to electronic cigarettes, including

any refill, cartridge, and any other component of an electronic cigarette."

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§ 6400. Sale or Distribution of Tobacco Products to Minors Persons Under Twenty-One (21) Years of Age Prohibited.

It *shall* be a violation of this Chapter for any person to sell or distribute tobacco products or electronic cigarettes to minors—any person under twenty-one (21) years of age. It *shall* not be a violation of this Chapter for any person to refuse to sell or distribute tobacco products or electronic cigarettes to any person whom the seller or the distributor reasonably believes to be under twenty-seven (27) years of age, and who is unable to produce acceptable photographic identification and proof that he is over the age of eighteen (18) twenty-one (21) years.

The sale or distribution of electronic cigarettes to minors any person under twenty-one (21) years of age, or its possession by a minor such person, is prohibited and *shall* be regulated and enforced pursuant to this Chapter. Any provision of this Chapter applicable to the regulation and prohibition of the sale or distribution of tobacco products to a minor any person under twenty-one (21) years of age, or possession by a minor such person, *shall* be applicable to electronic cigarettes and any other component of an electronic cigarette, and *shall* be regulated and enforced in the same manner as tobacco products, to include the applicability of all penalties and fines.

(a) Vending machines selling tobacco products or electronic cigarettes *shall* be located so that they are accessible only to persons over the age of eighteen (18) twenty-one (21) years, or are under the constant, direct supervision and unobstructed line of sight of the person authorizing the installation or placement of the tobacco or electronic cigarette vending machine upon the premises he manages

or otherwise controls, or his agent or employee. Said supervising adult person, who *must* be at least twenty-one (21) years of age, *shall* ensure that minors-persons under twenty-one (21) years of age do not purchase tobacco products or electronic cigarettes from vending machines. A person who authorizes the installation or placement of the tobacco or electronic cigarette vending machine upon premises he manages, or otherwise controls, and who knows or should know that the tobacco or electronic cigarette vending machine will likely be used by minors-persons under twenty-one (21) years of age, *shall* be liable if minors—such persons purchase tobacco products or electronic cigarettes from said machines.

(b) A licensee or an employer may distribute tobacco products or electronic cigarettes to any employee who handles tobacco products or electronic cigarettes in the course of the commercial distribution or sale of the products. In any proceeding for the suspension or revocation of any license, and based upon a violation of this Section, proof that the defendant licensee or his agent or employee demanded and was shown, before furnishing any tobacco product or electronic cigarette to a minor any person under twenty-one (21) years of age, an identification card, *shall* be a defense to the charges.

§ 6401. Acceptable Forms of Identification.

The following are the only acceptable instruments of identification as required by §6400:

(a) a valid unexpired driver's license issued by any state, territory or possession of the United States;

1	(b) an official identification issued by the Federal or a state

3	(c) an armed forces identification card;
4	(d) a valid, unexpired passport; and
5	(e) an alien registration receipt card (green card).
6	§ 6402. Display of Prohibition on Sales of Tobacco Products
7	to Minors Persons Under Twenty-One (21) Years of Age.
8	All licensees shall post notice that this Chapter prohibits the
9	sale of tobacco products to minors persons under twenty-one (21)
10	years of age.
11	(a) In the case of a retail operation, notices shall be publicly and
12	conspicuously displayed in the licensee's place of business in letters at
13	least two inches (2") in height.
14	(b) In the case of vending machine, the licensee shall affix to
15	the front of each vending machine a sign in letters at least one-half
16	inch (1/2") in height.
17	(c) Any licensee who violates this Section shall be fined Fifty
18	Dollars (\$50.00) per violation.
19	§ 6403. Licensee Responsible for Employee Actions.
20	Acts or omissions of an agent or employee of a licensee that
21	violate any provisions of this Chapter shall be deemed to be acts or
22	omissions of the licensee.
23	§6404. Penalties for Selling or Distributing Tobacco Products to
24	Minors Persons Under Twenty-One (21) Years of Age.
25	(a) In addition to any other penalties and fines that may be
26	levied, any person who violates § 6400 of this Chapter shall be
27	penalized as follows:

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- (1) in the case of a first violation in any five (5) year period, the person *shall* be fined Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) and *shall* be notified, in writing, of penalties levied for further violations;
- (2) in the case of a second violation in any five (5) year period, the person *shall* be fined One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and, in the case of a licensee, the license *shall* be suspended for ninety (90)days;
- (3) in the case of a third violation in any five (5) year period, the person *shall* be fined Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars(\$2,500.00) and, in the case of a licensee, the license *shall* be suspended for one hundred eighty (180) days;
- (4) in the case of four (4) or more violations within any five (5) -year period, the person *shall* be fined Five Thousand Dollars(\$5,000.00) and, in the case of a licensee, the license *shall* be revoked. The revoked retailer *shall* be ineligible to apply for a new license for two (2) years after the effective date of the revocation.
- (b) Failure to pay a fine levied under this Chapter within thirty (30) days of the date the fine becomes effective *shall* result in suspension of the licensee's license until such fines are paid.
- (c) During any suspension or revocation of a license under this Section, the licensee *shall* not sell tobacco products and *shall* remove all tobacco products from all areas covered by the suspended license. In addition, any new application for a license to sell tobacco products while a licensee is suspended under this Chapter *shall* be denied.

(d) All tobacco products sold over the counter *shall* be displayed and located where they *shall* be inaccessible to minors persons under twenty-one (21) years of age. Any vendor who violates this provision *shall* pay a penalty of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00).

§ 6405.MinorsPersons Under Twenty-One (21) Years of Age Prohibited from Possession, Use and Purchase of Tobacco Products.

It *shall* be a violation of this Chapter for any minor person under twenty-one (21) years of age to use or be in possession of tobacco products or to attempt to purchase tobacco products using false identification.

§ 6406. Tobacco Education for Minors Persons Under Twenty-One (21) Years of Age.

Any minorperson under twenty-one (21) years of age who violates § 6405 of this Chapter *shall* attend an education program on tobacco products to include smoking cessation information administered by the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center, the Department of Public Health and Social Services, the Department of Education or other government agencies with similar programs approved by one of these agencies."

Section 4. Effective Date; Application. This Act *shall* take effect on January 1, 2018.
