AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (e) TO ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 3, TITLE 10 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO ALLOWING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES TO IMPLEMENT A SCHOOL-LOCATED VACCINATION (SLV) PROGRAMS IN GUAM'S SCHOOLS AND INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

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- Section 1. A new subsection (e) is added to Article 3, Chapter 3, Title 10 Guam
- 4 Code Annotated to read as follows:
- 5 "(e) Nothing herein shall be construed or interpreted as to prevent the Department
- 6 of Public Health and Social Services from implementing a School-located
- 7 Vaccination (SLV) program in any school or institution of higher learning on
- 8 Guam for the purpose of administering vaccines required by subsection (a), supra.
- 9 Such SLV program may additionally include, but not be limited to, the
- administering of tuberculin skin tests (TST), Human papillomavirus virus (HPV)
- vaccines, annual influenza (Flu Shot) vaccines or any other vaccines not required
- by subsection (a), supra, but recommended by the United States Centers for
- 13 Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Such SLV programs may be implemented
- in public schools, individually or on a system-wide basis subject to a memorandum
- of understanding between the Department of Public Health and Social Services and
- the Guam Department of Education.

To the extent allowable and practical, the Department of Public Health and Social 1 Services may bill any health insurance/plan company, Medicaid, the Medically 2 Indigent Program (MIP), the Child Health Insurance Program (CHIP) or any other 3 party providing coverage for which the child is covered for the cost of the 4 Vaccines/immunizations, supplies to administer Vaccines/immunizations and the 5 administering of the Vaccines/immunizations. The Department of Public Health 6 and Social Services is not permitted to bill any party for any vaccines or supplies 7 that were received through federal programs or donations where the acceptance of 8 such vaccines and supplies prohibits such billing. Revenues realized from such 9 billing activities shall be used to cover the costs of the Department of Public 10 Health and Social Services and the Guam Department of Education related to the 11 SLV program and maintained in separate fund and bank account. Billing and 12 accounting services may be administered by the Department of Administration or 13 may be outsourced to a private accounting firm. All receipts, expenditures and 14 financial statements shall be subject to audit and review periodically as determined 15 by the Guam Office of Public Accountability." 16
