AN AN ACT TO ADD § 4126 TO CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE 17 GCA, RELATIVE TO THE REQUIREMENT OF GUAM PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS TO FILL OUT THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA) IN ORDER TO PROVIDE MORE STUDENTS WITH FINANCIAL AID AND PROVIDE MORE FINANCIAL RESOURCES TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM AND GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslatura finds that several states including Illinois, Texas and Louisiana, require their graduating seniors to apply for and submit a free application for federal student aid (FAFSA) in hopes of expanding access to financial assistance, thus encouraging an increase in college enrollment and completion. It is the intention of I Liheslatura to stimulate the academic development for our students and strengthen the financial integrity for our postsecondary institutions by increasing the federal funds they

National college access groups say high school seniors leave millions of dollars in federal financial aid on the table by not completing the FAFSA form.

- 1 Nationwide, eligible high school seniors missed out on \$2.6 billion in federal Pell
- 2 Grants because they did not fill out a FAFSA form. Greater FAFSA completion
- 3 could lead to more financial aid for students and more financial resources for UOG
- 4 and GCC. *I Liheslatura* finds the application process is ephemeral and exemptions
- 5 are feasible through waiver requests and with the help of school guidance
- 6 counselors, as is the procedure in states with this law.

Section 2. FAFSA Application Requirement. There is hereby *added* a new §4126 Chapter 4 of Title 17 GCA to read:

"§4126: FAFSA Application Requirement."

As a prerequisite to receiving a high school diploma from a public high school and charter school, graduating seniors must complete and submit a free application for federal student aid (FAFSA). Each high school, if applicable, must provide the student's parent or guardian any support or assistance necessary to comply with this section. A high school must award a high school diploma to a student who is unable to meet the requirements due to extenuating circumstances, as determined by the high school, when:

- (a) A parent or legal custodian, or a student legally emancipated or of the legal age of majority, certifies a waiver in writing to their principal if he or she refuses to complete such an application or
- (b) A school counselor authorizes the student to decline to complete and submit the financial aid application for good cause, as determined by the school counselor.
