AN ACT TO AMEND § 77302(a) OF ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 77, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND TO ADD A NEW § 34126 TO ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 34, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE AND TO ADD A NEW § 60205 TO ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 60, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE AND TO REPEALED AND REENACT § 70.10.3 ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 70, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AS § 34127 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 34, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING VOLUNTEERS TO ENFORCE ANIMAL ABUSE LAWS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Expansion of authority for CAPE volunteers to include animal
- abuse and cruelty citations. § 77302(a) of Article 3, Chapter 77, Title 10, Guam
- 4 Code Annotated is *amended* to read as follows:
- 5 "(a) Pursuant to § 3401.1(h) of Article 4, Chapter 3 of Title 16, Guam Code
- 6 Annotated, the Chief of Police is authorized to recruit volunteers to assist the
- 7 Guam Police Department in the enforcement of the accessible parking and littering
- laws, and the Natasha Protection Act of 2005 relative to the regulation of smoking
- 9 activities pursuant to Chapter 90 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated. In addition to
- these duties, the Chief of Police shall authorize the use of volunteers to patrol the
- school campuses of the Guam Department of Education during non-school hours.
- 12 The volunteers shall take no enforcement action during their patrol of the school
- campuses, and shall notify the police of suspicious activity or crimes in progress.

- 1 The Superintendent of Education shall cooperate with the Chief of Police to
- 2 implement this Section. The volunteers are authorized to issue summons, notices
- 3 to appear, citations and notices of violation for offenses committed under the
- 4 provisions of §§ 70.10 et. seq. of Article 1, Chapter 70, Title 9, Guam Code
- 5 Annotated. The volunteers are also authorized to impound animals subject to §
- 6 34127 of Article 1, Chapter 34, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated if exigent
- 7 <u>circumstances are established by plain view."</u>

- 9 Section 2. Summons, Citation or Notices of Violation. A new § 34126 is added
- to Article 1, Chapter 34, Title 10, Guam Code to read as follows:
- 11 § 34126 Arrests, Summons, Notices to Appear, Citations or Notices of
- 12 Violation for Crimes Involving Animal Abuse.
- 13 (a) Peace officers, and others authorized by law to issue summons, notices to
- appear, citations and notices of violation for violations of §§ 70.10 et. seq. of
- 15 Article 1, Chapter 70, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, may use the "Guam Uniform
- 16 Complaint and Citation" form or any other form authorized by the Director of
- 17 Agriculture for citing any violation of §§ 70.10 et. seq. of Article 1, Chapter 70,
- 18 <u>Title 9, Guam Code Annotated.</u>
- 19 (b) Summons, notice to appear and citation forms in section (a) supra, shall
- 20 comply with the provision of Public Law, the Guam Administrative Rules and
- 21 Regulations or the Rules of the Unified Judiciary.
- 22 (c) Notices of violation may be issued to allow residents time to remedy violations.
- 23 Such violations must be remedied within five (5) calendar days (or longer if an
- 24 extension is expressly approved by the Director of Agriculture). Any violation not
- 25 remedied with in the time allotted may be cited or the violator may be summoned

- 1 to appear in court to answer for said violation. Notices of violations shall be in
- 2 form approved by Director of Agriculture and include, but not be limited to, the
- anature of the violation, the citation in the Guam Code for the Violation, the time
- 4 <u>limit to remedy the violation and the procedures to file an extension for remedy.</u>
- 5 (d) Summons, citations and notices of violation shall be posted on the front door or
- 6 another conspicuous area of a home or building including walls and fences.
- 7 (e) Nothing herein is intended to prevent a peace officer from making arrests for a
- 8 violation of §§ 70.10 et. seq. of Article 1, Chapter 70, Title 9, Guam Code
- 9 Annotated consistent with the provisions of Chapter 20 of Title 8, Guam Code
- 10 Annotated.

- 12 **Section 3. Volunteers.** A new § 60205 is added to Article 2, Chapter 60, Title 5,
- 13 Guam Code to read as follows:
- 14 **"§ 60205. PAWS Volunteers.**
- 15 The Director of Agriculture is authorized to recruit PAWS (Protecting Animal
- 16 Welfare and Safety) volunteers to assist the Guam Department of Agriculture in
- 17 the enforcement of the Animal Cruelty laws in Article 1, Chapter 70, Title 9, Guam
- 18 Code Annotated. The volunteers are authorized to issue citations and notices of
- violation for offenses committed under the provisions of §§ 70.10 et. seq. of
- 20 Article 1, Chapter 70, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated. The volunteers are also
- 21 authorized to impound animals subject to § 34127. of Article 1, Chapter 34, Title
- 22 10, Guam Code Annotated if exigent circumstances are established by plain view.
- 23 The Director shall establish identifying credentials including, but not limited to,
- 24 identification (ID) cards and badges and the appropriate use thereof. The Director
- 25 shall establish procedures for recruitment and termination of volunteers and may

- 1 require certification, training or education programs to be completed. No person
- 2 required to register under Chapter 89 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated is eligible
- 3 to be a volunteer under this section.
- 4 The Director may outsource the coordination and supervision of PAWS volunteers
- 5 to the non-governmental organization that operates the animal shelter or other not-
- 6 for-profit animal protection organization. The agreement with the non-
- 7 governmental organization to coordinate and supervise the PAWS volunteers may
- 8 include, but not be limited to, provisions for waivers of liability, a code of
- 9 standards, ethics and conduct; limitations of authority and training. The Director
- may revoke a volunteer's authority, granted by this section, at any time and for any
- 11 reason. The Department is not liable for any torts committed by a non-
- 12 governmental organization, supra, its directors, members, employees or
- 13 volunteers."
- 14 Nothing herein is construed to limit the Department's ability to administer this
- 15 program consistent with the laws of Guam the Guam Administrative Rules and
- Regulations (G.A.R.R.), including but not limited to, the provisions of Chapter 9 of
- 17 5 GCA or Chapter 6 of 4 GCA.

- 19 Section 4. § 70.10.3 Article 1, Chapter 70, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated is
- 20 repealed and reenacted as § 34127 of Article 1, Chapter 34, Title 10, Guam Code
- 21 Annotated to read as follows:
- 22 "§ 70.10.3. Authority to Enter Premises and Court Proceedings.
- 23 (a) If there is probable cause to believe that any animal is being subjected to
- 24 treatment in violation of § 70.10, § 70.10.1 or § 70.10.2 of this Chapter, any officer

- 1 under exigent circumstances may enter the premises to impound the animal(s).
- 2 Notice of said impoundment shall be conspicuously posted on the premises.
- 3 (1) An officer is not liable for any damages for an entry under Subsection (a)
- 4 of this Section unless the damages were caused by reckless behavior.
- 5 (2) Any animal(s) so impounded shall be held at the animal care facility
- 6 designated pursuant to § 34118 of Chapter 34, Title 10 GCA.

- 8 § 34127. Authority to Enter Premises and Court Proceedings for Crimes
- 9 **Involving Animal Abuse.**
- 10 If there is probable cause to believe that any animal is being subjected to treatment
- in violation of § 70.10 et. seq. of Article 1, Chapter 70, Title 9, Guam Code
- Annotated, any peace officer or volunteer, under exigent circumstances, may enter
- 13 the premises to impound the animal. Notice of said impoundment shall be
- conspicuously posted on the premises.
- 15 (a) A peace officer or volunteer is not liable for any damages for an entry
- under this Section unless the damages were caused by reckless behavior.
- (b) Any animal so impounded shall be held at the animal care facility
- designated pursuant to § 34118 of Chapter 34, Title 10 Guam Code
- 19 <u>Annotated.</u>"
