## AN ACT TO AMEND § 19.20 OF CHAPTER 19, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO STRENGTHENING PENALTIES FOR PERSONS CONVICTED OF ASSAULTING HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that during times of public health emergencies, 3 the people of Guåhan may experience levels of anxiety and stress that may result in 4 behavior not typical of our island people. I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that 5 healthcare providers responding to public health emergencies and who are on the 6 front lines providing critical care and treatment for our community may be at a 7 higher risk of encountering individuals exhibiting dangerous behavior. It is, 8 therefore, the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to protect against behavior that 9 impede, interrupt, or otherwise obstruct the safe and efficient delivery of critical 10 medical care to members of the community. 11

Section 2. Protection of Healthcare Workers. § 19.20 of Chapter 19, Title
 9, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

"§ 19.20. Aggravated Assault; Defined & Punished.

(a) A person is guilty of aggravated assault if he either recklessly causes or
 attempts to cause:

- 3 (1) serious bodily injury to another in circumstances manifesting
  4 extreme indifference to the value of human life;
- (2) serious bodily injury to another; 5 (3) bodily injury to another with a deadly weapon; 6 (4) bodily injury to a person who is in the process of providing 7 healthcare services, during a State of Emergency or disaster declaration, 8 where the actor knew or should have known that the victim is in the process 9 of providing healthcare services. 10 (b) Aggravated assault under Paragraph (1) of Subsection (a) is a felony of the 11 second degree; aggravated assault under Paragraphs (2), (3), or (4) (3) or Subsection 12 (a) is a felony of the third degree; provided that any person convicted of aggravated 13 assault shall not be eligible for work release or educational programs outside the 14
- 15 confines of prison."
