AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 4124(b)(1) OF CHAPTER 4, TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CREATING AN EXEMPTION FROM THE SERVICE-LEARNING GRADUATION REQUIREMENT FOR TWELFTH-GRADE STUDENTS OF SCHOOL YEAR 2019-2020 AND REQUIRING THE SUPERINTENDENT OF EDUCATION TO SUBMIT THE LIST OF ELIGIBLE STUDENTS TO THE GUAM EDUCATION BOARD.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslatura* finds that Public
- 3 Law 30-53 required the Guam Department of Education high school students to
- 4 complete seventy-five (75) hours of service learning in order to graduate from high
- 5 school beginning with the ninth (9th) grade class in School Year 2011-2012.
- 6 I Liheslatura recognizes that the service-learning requirement as established
- 7 requires students to actively participate in organized service activities. *I Liheslatura*
- 8 further recognizes that due to the COVID-19 outbreak, students may be unable to
- 9 physically participate in these activities.
- Thus, it is the intent of *I Liheslatura* to create an exemption for twelfth (12^{th})
- grade students of School Year 2019-2020 from the requirements set forth in Public
- 12 Law 30-53, provided that the student has met all other graduation requirements. It is

also the intent of *I Liheslatura* to require the Superintendent of Education to submit the list of students eligible for this exemption to the Guam Education Board.

Section 2. A new §4124(b)(1) of Chapter 4, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby added to read the following:

"(b) Beginning with the ninth (9th) grade class in the 2011 and 2012 School Year, and for every school year thereafter, each student *shall* complete seventy-five (75) hours of service learning as a requirement for high school graduation. Service hours earned *shall* be printed on each report card. The Superintendent, with the approval of the Board, shall establish the minimum number of hours of service learning required by the end of the student's eleventh (11th) grade year in order to be promoted to senior status. The Superintendent, with the approval of the Board, *shall* establish the prorated number of hours of service learning for students transferring into the Department of Education from off-island, or from private schools, after the start of their sophomore year to be promoted to senior status and high school graduation.

(1) The twelfth (12th) grade students of School Year 2019-2020 *shall* be exempt from the provisions of this Section, provided that the student has met all other graduation requirements. The Superintendent of Education *shall* submit to the Guam Education Board the list of students eligible for this exemption."

Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect

- 1 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
- 2 Act are severable.
- 3 Section 4. Effective Date. Provisions in this Act shall take effect
- 4 immediately upon enactment.
