AN ACT TO AMEND § 19404 OF ARTICLE 4, CHAPTER 19, TITLE 10 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ENFORCEMENT OF RULES PROMULGATED IN AN EXECUTIVE ORDER RELATIVE TO A DECLARED EMERGENCY TO PUBLIC HEALTH OR SAFETY.

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
- 2 Section 1. §19404 of Article 4, Chapter 19, Title 10 Guam Code Annotated is
- 3 amended to read:
- 4 **"§ 19404. Enforcement.**
- 5 (a) During a state of public health emergency, the public health authority may
- 6 request assistance in enforcing orders pursuant to this Chapter from the public safety
- 7 authority. The public safety authority may request assistance from the organized
- 8 militia in enforcing the orders of the public health authority.
- 9 <u>(b) The governor, in each executive order, shall designate the relevant agency,</u>
- 10 department, or entity responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of the
- 11 executive order.
- 12 (c) Except in cases where a different punishment is provided by this
- 13 Chapter or other law, any person who violates any provision of an executive order

1 or order, rule, or regulation promulgated pursuant to this Chapter, in the first instance, is guilty of a violation punishable by a fine not to exceed One Hundred 2 3 Dollars (\$100.00). A second violation shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), and five hundred (\$500) for every subsequent 4 violation. Any person violating any provision of an executive order or order, rule, or 5 6 regulation in the third or more instance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed One thousand dollars 7 8 (\$1,000.00) or by imprisonment for not to exceed One (1) year or by both such fine 9 and imprisonment. 10 **Applicability.** This Act shall apply only to executive orders, 11 orders, rules, or regulations relative to the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) public 12 health emergency, as of April 13, 2020. Such enforcement authority granted by this

Act shall be null and void on the termination of the COVID-19 public health

emergency as provided under 10 GCA § 19405."
