AN ACT TO AMEND § 19403(a) AND TO ADD A NEW ITEM (6) TO § 19403(b), BOTH OF ARTICLE 4, CHAPTER 19, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE EMERGENCY POWERS OF THE GOVERNOR AND THE PUBLIC HEALTH AUTHORITY DURING THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. § 19403(a) of Article 4, Chapter 19, Title 10, Guam Code
Annotated is *amended*, to read:

- 4 "(a) Emergency Powers. During a state of public health emergency, *I*5 *Maga'hågan Guåhan* [the Governor] may:
- 6 (1) through an executive order suspend, the provisions of any 7 regulatory statute prescribing procedures for conducting local business, 8 or the orders, rules and regulations of any government of Guam agency, 9 to the extent that strict compliance with the same would prevent, hinder 10 or delay necessary action (including emergency purchases) by the 11 public health authority to respond to the public health emergency, or 12 increase the health threat to the population;

(2)utilize all available resources of the government of Guam, 1 2 as reasonably necessary to respond to the public health emergency; 3 transfer the direction, personnel or functions of the (3)4 government of Guam departments and agencies in order to perform or 5 facilitate response and recovery programs regarding the public health 6 emergency; mobilize all or any part of the organized militia into 7 (4)8 service; an executive order directing the organized militia to report for 9 active duty shall state the purpose for which it is mobilized and the objectives to be accomplished; 10 11 (5) provide aid to and seek aid from the federal government in 12 accordance with any emergency compact made with the government of 13 Guam; seek aid from the federal government in accordance with 14 (6)federal programs or requirements; 15 16 through an executive order, and upon consultation with the (7)public health authority, order a curfew that shall not extend beyond 17 18 fifteen (15) calendar days in response to the COVID-19 public health 19 emergency to prevent the spread of the disease and protect the public's 20 health, safety, and welfare; provided, that such curfew is implemented 21 by the least restrictive means necessary; and through an executive order, and upon consultation with the 22 (8) 23 public health authority, issue a shelter-in-place directive in response to 24 the COVID-19 public health emergency to prevent the spread of the disease and protect the public's health, safety, and welfare; provided, 25 26 that such shelter-in-place directive is implemented by the least restrictive means necessary and shall be subject to § 19403(b)(6)." 27

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- Section 2. A new § 19403(b)(6) is *added* to Article 4 of Chapter 19, Title
 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:
- "(6) planning, implementing, and promulgating rules and regulations
 relative to a shelter-in-place directive issued by the Governor pursuant to §
 19403(a)(8) to respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency. Said rules
 and regulations shall allow for reasonable movement deemed essential by the
 public health authority, which shall be clearly defined in the directive or
 guidance thereto."

9 Section 3. Prior to exercising her authority under § 19403(a)(7) or (8) of 10 Article 4, Chapter 19, Title 10 GCA, relative to curfew or shelter-in-place, the 11 Governor shall make available to the public:

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(a) any and all plans for obtaining and distributing tests kits forCOVID-19 on Guam, and future plans for conducting tests on Guam;

- (b) any and all information regarding the number of personal
 protective equipment (PPE) available to the government of Guam and its plans
 to obtain and distribute the PPE in response to the COVID-19 public health
 emergency;
- 18 (c) to the extent practicable, information regarding known public
 19 places at which any confirmed positive COVID-19 individual has frequented
 20 seven (7) days prior to testing positive; and
- (d) to the extent practicable, access to COVID-19 testing for
 individuals who have come into close contact with another confirmed positive
 COVID-19 individual.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
