## AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 6225.2 TO CHAPTER 6 OF TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PROVIDING DOUBLE PAY TO EMPLOYEES WORKING DURING THE COVID-19 PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY.

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
2	Section 1. A new § 6225.2 is added to Chapter 6 of Title 4, Guam Code
3	Annotated, to read:
4	"§ 6225.2. To Establish Provisions for Double Pay for all
5	employees working during the COVID-19 public health
6	emergency. Government of Guam employees, who were required to
7	remain on duty to provide essential services during Pandemic
8	Condition of Readiness 1 until the declaration of Pandemic Condition
9	of Readiness 2 during the COVID-19 public health emergency, shall
10	be paid at double the regular rate:
11	(a) Employees who in the course of their duties are in direct
12	contact or in close physical proximity to a population
13	infected with or may be reasonably suspected to be infected
14	with COVID-19 such as sworn public safety or law

enforcement officers, health care providers, and other positions performing essential critical mission duties;

- 3 (b) Employees who in the course of their duties may
  4 incidentally come into contact with or close physical
  5 proximity to a population infected with or may be
  6 reasonably suspected to be infected with COVID-19,
  7 including those employees who are providing humanitarian
  8 services or direct assistance to the general public; or
- 9 (c) Employees whose positions do not allow them to telework 10 and are mandated to perform their job duties at physical 11 worksites pre-determined by their agency heads, as required 12 by the government of Guam's response to the COVID-19 13 pandemic.
- 14 (d) Pay at double the regular rate, for the employees enumerated
  15 in this Section, *shall* be retroactive to March 14, 2020.

16 **Section 2.** *I Maga'hagan Guåhan* may use the funding provided by the 17 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to fund the 18 provisions of Section 1 of this Bill.

19 Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to 20 any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such 21 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be 22 given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the 23 provisions of this Act are severable.

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**Section 3.** This Act shall be effective upon enactment.

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
