AN ACT TO AMEND § 6226 OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 6, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING PROPER AND JUST COMPENSATION OF GOVERNMENT OF GUAM EMPLOYEES REQUIRED TO REPORT TO WORK DURING A STATE OF EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the Governor of Guam declared a State of Public Health Emergency via Executive Order 2020-03 on March 15, 2020. With the declaration, many of our island's government of Guam employees were determined to be essential employees, physically working toward battling the pandemic, providing front-line services to our island. All other employees were placed on excused absence status and allowed to remain home, working from home.

The Governor of Guam determined that the application of the double pay rule would not be feasible.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that an opinion on the matter was issued by the Office of the Attorney General of Guam and clarified that there was only one of three (3) pre-requisites in law that was met in order for the double pay rule to be applicable.

In line with the opinion of the Attorney General, it is the intent of I
Liheslaturan Guåhan to amend the law to provide for clarity on the applicability of
the double pay rule for this pandemic emergency and all future state of emergencies
declared by the Governor of Guam.

Section 2. § 6226 of Article 2, Chapter 6, Title 4 of Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

7 "§ 6226. Employees: Compensation During Typhoons a State of 8 Emergency: Exceptions.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule or regulation, Eemployees who work during typhoon an emergency periods, defined as Typhoon Conditions I and II a disaster, as that term is used in 5 GCA § 32103(s), public health emergency, as that term is used in 10 GCA § 19104(m), or other event causing a state of emergency to be-as declared by the Governor of Guam, shall be compensated in the following manner:

- (a) Employees occupying permanent positions in the classified service or the unclassified service, except for agency heads and their first assistants, by whatever title called, whose regularly scheduled hours of work fall within such an emergency period, but whose presence is not required at work, shall be granted administrative leave; provided that, any employee who is required to telework, or perform work duties remotely, shall be compensated at their regular rate of pay for all hours worked. Employees not occupying permanent positions are not eligible for administrative leave.
- (b) Employees not occupying permanent positions in the classified service, who were required to report to and did work for and

be on duty during such an emergency period shall be entitled to overtime double their regular rate of pay for all such hours worked.

- (c) Employees occupying permanent positions in the classified service or the unclassified service, except for agency heads and their first assistants, by whatever title called, whose regularly scheduled hours of work fall within such an emergency period and who are required to report for and be on duty during such emergency period shall be entitled to overtime double their regular rate of pay for all such hours worked including overtime, in addition to full compensation for any administrative leave taken.
- (d) Employees occupying permanent positions in the classified service or the unclassified service except, for agency heads and their first assistants, by whatever title called, whose regularly scheduled hours of work do not fall within such an emergency period, but who are required to report for and be on duty shall be entitled to overtime pay for all such hours worked including overtime, but not for administrative leave.
- (ed) In the event that an typhoon emergency period includes a legal holiday, then such employees required to report for and be on duty shall be entitled to overtime double their regular rate of pay for all such hours worked including overtime, in addition to full compensation for holiday leave.
- (e) I Maga'hågan Guåhan, in coordination with the Office of Civil Defense Administrator (OCD Administrator), shall determine which services are essential to an emergency period response, and shall prescribe the same via executive order. In accordance with the Guam Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (CEMP), the OCD

1	Administrator shall coordinate as the Territory Coordinating Officer
2	(TCO) with I Maga'håga.
3	(f) An employee's regular rate of pay shall not be reduced due to
4	the operational status of the employee's respective agency or
5	department.
6	(g) Compensation at double the regular rate of pay as authorized
7	under this Section shall be the maximum amount of compensation any
8	employee may receive for hours worked during an emergency period.
9	(h) Employees of the Office of the Governor, the Office of the
10	Lieutenant Governor, department and agency heads, and their first
11	assistants, by whatever title which called shall not be entitled to double
12	their regular rate of pay under this Section.
13	(i) Employees who are on annual or sick leave status when a state
14	of emergency is declared by the Governor and are not required to report
15	to duty, shall be considered released from duty with pay and without
16	charge to leave for the emergency period.
17	(j) Employees entitled to compensation under this Section shall
18	be compensated for the duration of the declared state of emergency and
19	any extension thereof."
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20	Section 3. Effective Date. This Act <i>shall</i> be effective retroactive to March
21	14, 2020.
