AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §1115 TO CHAPTER 1, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND TAXATION TO ISSUE A REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL (RFP) FOR A PILOT ROBOTIC PROCESS AUTOMATION PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslatura Guåhan finds that with the current economic situation of the government of Guam, adopting a hybrid workforce will benefit the day-to-day processes of departments that work closely with the public. A significant portion of work hours are used to input information from one government of Guam system to another. Time allotted for data entry and administrative processes can be shortened to improve task management and, also, reduce interaction to mitigate the spread of Covid-19. Robotic Process Automation (RPA) is the technology that allows computer software, or "robot", to emulate and integrate the actions of a human interacting with digital systems to execute administrative processes. I Liheslatura Guåhan finds that in recent years, the Guam Power Authority has integrated automation to make computer processes that would normally take an hour into mere minutes, saving thousands of equivalent laborious work hours in a year.

It is therefore the intent of the *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to use Robotic Process Automation to improve government efficiency, eliminate human error in transferring data from system to another and improve the experience for the public. Japan, South

1	Korea, Singapore, and Taiwan governments have used RPA to greatly reduce the			
2	need for human labor to do repetitive computer tasks. The greatest need for such a			
3	pilot program is at the Department of Revenue and Taxation, where a proces			
4	automation program can help with the departments operations which are vital to			
5	taxpayers.			
6	Section 2. §1115 of Chapter 1, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated is hereby			
7	added to read as follows:			
8	"§1115. Request for Proposal - Robotic Process Automation (RPA)			
9	Systems.			
10	Within ninety (90) days of enactment of this Act, the Department of Revenue			
11	and Taxation ("DRT") shall issue a Request for Proposal ("RFP") for a prospective			
12	bidder, contractor, or offeror to consult with the Department of Revenue and			
13	Taxation on Robotic Process Automation (RPA) system in the government and to			
14	implement RPA systems. The company shall:			
15	(a) analyze processes in the department and to identify opportunities for			
16	robotic process automation to take over data entry processes which can be			
17	streamlined, including fiscal management systems, enhanced intragovernmental			
18	communication, reduction in redundancy of government forms for taxpayers and a			
19	simplified permitting process for businesses;			
20	(b) review and procure Information Technology (IT) infrastructure needed for			
21	a RPA system including the owning, operation, maintenance and oversight of any			
22	and all security, equipment and software deemed necessary to implement a RPA			
23	system; and			
24	(c) conduct annual training for all government of Guam IT employees to			
25	troubleshoot and make repairs to any software that is necessary to make the			
26	necessary upgrades.			

This RFP shall be for no longer than a five (5) year agreement with no						
additional licensing requirements for future compensation. The prospective bidder,						
contractor, or offeror shall issue an annual report thirty (30) days before the end of						
each fiscal year outlining the government processes undergoing RPA systems; the						
cost of maintaining and operating RPA systems; and the cost of training for						
government of Guam IT employees."						
Section 3. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon enactment.						
Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any						
person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions						
or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision						
or application and to this end the provisions of this Act is severable.
