AN ACT RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE GUAM ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (GEDA) TO CONTRACT A PROGRAM MANAGEMENT OFFICE TO **GOVERNMENT** MODERNIZE THE OF **GUAM'S** FINANCIAL **MANAGEMENT SYSTEM** AND TRANSACTION PROCESSING SYSTEM. **TWO** HUNDRED **AND APPROPRIATE** FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000) TO GEDA FOR SUCH PURPOSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 2 that the Government of Guam's information technology system for handling 3 4 finances, taxation, and payments are significantly outdated. The Department of 5 Revenue and Taxation's financial management system and the Department of 6 Administration's transaction processing system are both inefficient, costly, and lacking core necessary features, including industry-common time-saving 7 automations and the ability to interconnect systems. Consequently, taxpayer value 8 9 is lost; greater manpower and cost is expended to manage our government's outdated 10 systems, and significant economic opportunities are lost due to slow payments and 11 processing.

With this legislation, *I Liheslatura* aims to modernize such systems by enabling the Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA) to contract an experienced consulting service provider to serve as a Program Management Office tasked with upgrading the Government of Guam's financial management system and transaction processing system. The Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation and the Guam Department of Administration shall participate throughout the modernization effort and must approve of the PMO prior to contracting. The Guam Office of Information Technology, the Port Authority of Guam, the Guam International Airport Authority, and the Guam Department of Customs and Quarantine shall also provide guidance, to ensure that new software systems will be able to interface with software systems used to track procurement, imports and exports.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan therefore intends to enable GEDA, through a PMO, to procure new financial management system and transaction processing system to reduce taxpayer costs and boost local economic development.

Section 2. The Guam Economic Development Authority (GEDA), with the assistance of the Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation (DRT), the Guam Department of Administration (DOA), and the Guam Office of Technology, shall procure a new financial management system and transaction processing system for use by the Government of Guam. To complete this mandate, GEDA may secure the services of a third-party consultant, through competitive bid, to serve as a Program Management Office (PMO) tasked with any of the following services that GEDA deems needed: research current and future government needs, provide guidance and recommendations based on industry best practices, develop procurement documents, evaluate bids, award contracts, manage contracts, and any other services deemed reasonable and appropriate by GEDA for the modernization of the Government of Guam's financial management system and transaction processing system.

Prior to being contracted, such consulting service provider shall demonstrate experience and competency with facilitating upgrades to similarly complex, large-scale financial and transaction management systems. Once contracted to serve as PMO, said consulting service provider shall not bid on, or financially profit from, any competitive procurements conducted under the oversight of the PMO as part of the software modernization efforts outlined by this Act.

Guam DRT and Guam DOA shall provide assistance and input throughout the process of modernization envisioned by this Act, and both the Director of DRT and the Director of DOA shall approve of the procurement of a PMO before GEDA may contract a consulting service provider to serve in such role.

The Port Authority of Guam, the Guam International Airport Authority, the Guam General Services Agency, the Guam Office of Technology, the Guam Department of Customs and Quarantine, the Guam Department of Land Management, and any other relevant government entities shall provide input and guidance to GEDA and its PMO, to ensure that the new financial management system and transaction processing system will be able to interface as needed with future software systems used to track procurement, imports and exports to Guam, or other relevant databases and electronic processes.

GEDA shall transmit quarterly reports to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and *I Maga'hagan Guahan* on the status of the PMO and all software modernization efforts, to include expenditure reports and summaries of all contracts. All applicable Guam laws and rules and regulations, including but not limited to the Open Government Law, shall continue to apply.

Section 3. Appropriation to the Guam Economic Development Authority. Two Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) is hereby appropriated from the Fiscal Year 2019 Unappropriated General Fund balance to the Guam Economic Development Authority for the purposes of contracting a Program

- 1 Management Office to assist in the procurement of a new financial management
- 2 system and transaction processing system completing for use by the Government of
- 3 Guam. The appropriation in this Section shall not lapse and shall continue until fully
- 4 expended. Said appropriation shall not preclude GEDA or the Government of Guam
- 5 from receiving federal aid or grants to pursue the aims of this Act.
- 6 **Section 4. Effective Date.** This Act shall become effective upon enactment.
- 7 **Section 5. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any
- 8 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall*
- 9 not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without
- 10 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are
- 11 severable.
