AN ACT TO AMEND § 1013 & § 1013.1 OF CHAPTER 10, TITLE 1, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AND ADD § 1013.2 OF CHAPTER 10, TITLE 1, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO THE FUNDING FOR THE GUAM ISLAND FAIR AND LIBERATION DAY CARNIVAL.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.

3 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the Mayors' Council of Guam is authorized

4 to maintain oversight of the Guam Island Fair Committee in order to make

arrangements for Guam's Liberation Day festivities. Further, I Liheslatura

recognizes that this responsibility requires adequate funding.

7 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to provide adequate

funding for the commemoration and celebration of the annual Liberation Day and to

appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) to the Mayor's

Council of Guam from the Guam Visitors Bureau's Rainy Day Fund in accordance

with Article 3, Chapter 9, Title 12 GCA.

**Section 2.** § 1013 of Chapter 10, Title 1, Guam Code Annotated, is amended

§ 1013. Guam Island Fair Committee.

The Mayors' Council of Guam is authorized and requested to annually appoint and maintain oversight of the Guam Island Fair Committee to plan and make appropriate arrangements for the celebration of this Fair.

The Committee shall be composed of one (1) representative from the Department of Administration (DOA), and one (1) representative from the Office of Public Accountability (OPA), and the First Lady Gentleman of Guam. The Committee shall also include members of patriotic, religious, or other civic organizations. In lieu of such Committee, the Mayors' Council of Guam may designate one (1) or more such civic organizations as sponsors to plan and arrange for the Fair, provided, that one (1) representative from the Department of Administration (DOA), one (1) representative from the Office of Public Accountability (OPA), and the First Lady Gentleman of Guam are members of that Committee. 

The net proceeds from the Guam Island-Fair shall be divided in the following manner:

- (a) The Mayors' Council of Guam shall be entitled to retain fifty percent (50%) of the net proceeds and may convey any interest or portion thereof to any charitable organization;
- (b) Fifty percent (50%) of the net proceeds shall be held in trust by the Council and monies in this trust shall be donated to a charity or worthy public cause as the First Lady shall solely determine.

The government of Guam may furnish a suitable site, if needed, but neither it nor any agencies, instrumentalities, nor employees may use government supplies or equipment in the planning and preparation for the Island Fair. Unless appropriated by *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature), or approved by the governing board of applicable autonomous agencies, no government funds or materials *shall* be used in the preparation of floats.

**Section 3.** § 1013.1 of Chapter 10, Title 1, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

# § 1013.1. Liberation Day Carnival.

- (a) Whenever the Guam Island Fair is to be held in a location other than the *Hagåtña* Paseo grounds, then any Civic Organization, as provided herein, may sponsor a Liberation Day Carnival for the same duration as the Guam Island Fair. In this instance, the Mayors' Council of Guam *shall* appoint a Liberation Day Carnival committee to plan and make appropriate arrangements for the celebration of this Carnival. The Committee *shall* be composed of members of patriotic, religious, or other civic organizations.
- (b) In the event the Guam Island Fair is not held at the Hagåtña Paseo grounds, then the sponsoring organization may utilize the Hagåtña Paseo grounds to sponsor its own Liberation Day Carnival as provided herein. The responsible governmental agency or agencies *shall* issue a permit to the sponsoring organization to conduct the Liberation Day Carnival at the Hagåtña Paseo grounds. The provisions of law contained in §§ 64.62 and 64.70 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated *shall* be applicable to the Liberation Day Carnival held at the Hagåtña Paseo grounds as provided herein.
- (c) The net proceeds from the Liberation Day Carnival shall be divided in the following manner:
  - (1) The Mayors' Council of Guam shall be entitled to retain fifty percent (50%) of the net proceeds and may convey any interest or portion thereof to any charitable organization; and

1	(2) Fifty percent (50%) of the net proceeds shall be held in trust by the
2	Council and monies in this trust shall be donated to a charity or worthy public
3	cause as the First Lady shall solely determine.
4	Mayors' Council of Guam shall be subjected to an audit by the Public
5	Auditor in calculating the net proceeds.
6	(dc) Whenever the Guam Island Fair is to be held at the Hagåtña Paseo
7	grounds, then such Fair will be consolidated with the Liberation Day Carnival as
8	provided herein, and the sections pertaining to the Guam Island Fair shall apply.
9	Section 4. § 1013.2 of Chapter 10, Title 1, Guam Code Annotated, is added
10	to read:
11	"§ 1013.2. Funding for Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival.
12	The sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) is hereby
13	appropriated to the Mayors' Council of Guam from the Guam Visitors Bureau's
14	Rainy Day Fund, in accordance with Article 3, Chapter 9, Title 12 GCA, to operate
15	the Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival activities. The Guam Visitors
16	Bureau shall submit to the Legislature a report of expenditures of all funds for the
17	Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival activities. The report shall contain
18	detailed information on each expenditure including the date, the amount and the
19	purpose. The report shall be submitted no later than August 31 annually.
20	The net proceeds from the Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival
21	activities shall be divided in the following manner:
22	(a) Forty percent (40%) of the net proceeds shall be held in trust by the
23	Council and monies in this trust shall be donated to a charity or worthy public
24	cause as the First Lady Gentleman shall solely determine; and
25	(b) The Mayors' Council of Guam shall be entitled to retain thirty
26	percent (30%) of the net proceeds and may convey any interest or portion
27	thereof to any charitable organization; and

1	(c) The Guam Visitors Bureau shall be entitled to retain thirty percent
2	(30%) of the net proceeds and may convey and interest or portion thereof to
3	any charitable organization."
4	Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any
5	person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall
6	not affect other provisions of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid
7	provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
8	Section 6. Effective Date. This act shall be effective upon enactment.
