AN ACT TO REPEAL § 8172 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 8, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE RESPONSIBLE USE OF TAXPAYER FUNDS THROUGH THE ELIMINATION OF AUTOMATIC RETIREMENT BENEFITS FOR ELECTIVE GUAM GOVERNORS, LIEUTENANT GOVERNORS. THEIR SURVIVORS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. § 8172 of Article 1, Chapter 8, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, 3 is hereby repealed in its entirety: "§ 8172. Retirement and Other Benefits Coverage of Elective Guam 4 5 Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Their Survivors. 6 Notwithstanding any provisions of this Chapter to the contrary: (a) Any person who is elected Governor or Lieutenant 7 Governor may retire following the completion of his term of office as 8 the Governor or Lieutenant Governor of the territory of Guam. He 9 10 shall be paid from the Retirement Fund by appropriation made by the 11 Legislature notwithstanding the amount of his contributions thereto an annual pension-during the remainder of his life in an amount equal to 12

1 and not to exceed fifty percent (50%) of the annual salary of the 2 Governor or Lieutenant Governor at the time he retires. (b) If a Governor or Lieutenant Governor shall become 3 4 physically or otherwise incapacitated he may make application for the pension provided for in the preceding paragraph and be eligible to 5 6 receive such annual pension for the same amount without regard to 7 age. (e) Whenever any person who is or has been an elected 8 Governor or Lieutenant Governor shall die and leave a widow 9 surviving him, an annuity shall be paid to such surviving widow, in an 10 11 amount equal to and not to exceed twenty percent (20%) of the annual 12 salary received by the deceased husband while in office. 13 (d) In implementing this Chapter with regard to determining annuities, survivors' benefits and death benefits, the provisions of law 14 set forth in Chapter 8 of the Government Code Annotated, as 15 16 amended, shall control. (e) Any elected Governor or Lieutenant Governor may elect to 17 18 receive other retirement benefits pursuant to Chapter 8 of the Government Code Annotated and upon so electing shall waive the 19 20 benefits provided by this Chapter. (f) (1) Annually, on or before the start of a fiscal year, the 21 Director of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund shall certify to 22 the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research the 23 24 amount required to implement the provisions of this Section (but not 25 to include the cost of benefits to be made pursuant to Chapter III, Title 26 V of the Government Code of Guam).

(A) Upon the acceptance of the amount so certified by
the Director of Bureau of Budget and Management Research,
said amount shall become an appropriation of the
Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund of the government
of Guam and, accordingly, shall be so recorded in the books of
accounts of the General Fund.

(B) Upon the release of the appropriation by the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, the Treasurer of Guam shall pay said amount to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund in increments provided by the release of the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research. (2) Within thirty (30) days after the appropriation is made hereunder, a copy of the instrument thereof shall be furnished to the Guam Legislature."

Section 2. Severability. If any provision of this Act or the application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
