AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §64.70.1 TO 9 GCA RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE USE OF "BINGO CARD MINDERS" FOR ALL BINGO OPERATORS UNDER 9 GCA §64.70.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds that there exists assistive technology to aid in the enjoyment of bingo activities for our physically challenged and our manamko' in the approved activity of bingo as authorized in 9 GCA §64.70. This measure will permit and make legal these "bingo card minders" currently being used by bingo parlors across the country and the world.

Section 2. Bingo Card Minders Authorized. A new §64.70.1 is hereby added
to 9 GCA, to read:

9 <u>"§64.70.1. Bingo Card Minders Authorized.</u>

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation the use of
 Bingo Card Minders is permitted for all bingo activities licensed under 9 GCA
 §64.70. For the purpose of this section, '*Bingo Card Minders*' are hand-held
 portable devices used to assist players in monitoring the numbers or symbols

announced by a *live* bingo caller as those numbers are called in a live bingo
 game."

3 Section 3. Date of Enactment. This Act shall become effective upon
4 enactment.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end provisions of this Act are severable.
