## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.
- 3 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the Department of Public Health and Social
- 4 Services (DPHSS) is in urgent need of a minimum of \$5.6 million dollars in order
- 5 to pay claims through the end of Fiscal Year 2019 for Medicaid, Child Health
- 6 Insurance Program (CHIP) and Enhanced Allotment Program (EAP). The
- 7 estimated \$5.6 million dollars does not account for potential medical claims that
- 8 have not been submitted to DPHSS yet.
- 9 The Medicaid Program, Child Health Insurance Program (CHIP) and
- 10 Enhanced Allotment Program (EAP) subsidizes health care costs for approximately
- 11 43,549 low-income individuals.
- 12 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that DPHSS has exhausted fiscal year 2019
- 13 appropriations for Medicaid claims from private providers. Appropriating \$5.6
- 14 million dollars for local match funding requirements for the Guam Medicaid
- program will allow DPHSS to access approximately \$6.8 million dollars in federal
- 16 Affordable Care Act (ACA) grant funds.
