AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW § 70108 TO CHAPTER 70 OF TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CREATING AND FUNDING AN INVASIVE SPECIES RAPID RESPONSE FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslatura finds that

Guam's environment is especially vulnerable to destruction caused by invasive

species. The Guam Invasive Species Council, which was established to address the

problem, is currently limited in its ability to respond quickly to the threat of invasive

7 I Liheslatura finds the creation of an Invasive Species Rapid Response Fund

will allow for the Guam Invasive Species Council, in partnership with the Research

Corporation of the University of Guam, to address threats quickly in a manner that

maintains procurement accountability and transparency. As such, the Invasive

Species Rapid Response Fund will serve as a short-term intervention while the

Council awaits legislative appropriation to allocate funds from the Guam Invasive

Species Inspections Fee Fund for longer-term management solutions.

Section 2. A new § 70108 is hereby *added* to Chapter 70 of Title 5, Guam

Code Annotated, to read:

"§ 70108 Invasive Species Rapid Response Fund

There is hereby created, separate and apart from other funds of the government of Guam, a fund to be known as the "Invasive Species Rapid Response Fund" (hereinafter "the Fund"), which shall not be commingled with the General Fund or any other fund of the government of Guam. Monies in the Fund shall be kept in a separate bank account, and shall not be subject to any transfer authority of *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*.

The Fund shall be administered by the Research Corporation of the University of Guam (hereinafter "RCUOG"), with all expenditures authorized by the Director of the Department of Agriculture. The Fund shall adhere to the procurement rules and regulations of RCUOG. The Fund shall be utilized to rapidly implement efforts to suppress and eradicate invasive species present in Guam. The Director of the Department of Agriculture shall make quarterly and annual reports to *I Maga 'hagån Guåhan* and *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* of the condition of, and activity within, the Fund."

Section 3. Section 4(b) of PL 31-43 is hereby *amended* to read:

"(b) The fees collected *shall* be expended to: (1) recruit and hire a Territorial Invasive Species Coordinator; (2) establish and provide staffing for a Biosecurity Division within the Department of Agriculture to provide inspection, quarantine and eradication of invasive species contained in any freight brought to Guam; (3) suppress and eradicate invasive species present in Guam; (4) fund an Invasive Species Rapid Response Fund to facilitate faster responses to invasive species threats; and (4 5) develop the Guam Invasive Species Management Plan and its updates. The Territorial Invasive Species Coordinator *shall* also serve as the Council

- 3 Section 4. Appropriation to the Invasive Species Rapid Response Fund.
- 4 Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) from the Guam Invasive Species
- 5 Inspection Fee Fund are hereby appropriated to the Invasive Species Rapid Response
- 6 Fund.
- 7 Section 5. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment into
- 8 law.
- 9 Section 6. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to
- any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity
- shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect
- 12 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
- 13 Act are severable.
