AN ACT TO AMEND 12 GCA § 11105 TO ALLOW THE PUBLIC DEFENDER SERVICE CORPORATION TO RECEIVE AND ADMINISTER GRANTS AND ENTER INTO INTRA-GOVERNMENTAL AND INTER-GOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENTS TO PROVIDE LEGAL SERVICES FOR UNDER-REPRESENTED GROUPS AND FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING AN ELDER LAW CENTER

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds the need to provide avenues for civil legal aid and other services to assist Guam's vulnerable, underserved, and under-represented populations, including the elderly, victims of violence, individuals with disabilities, and individuals and families of low income. Local resources to fund these programs are limited, but federal grants to support them may be available. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds the Public Defender Service Corporation (Corporation)—if allowed to apply, receive, and administer federal

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the Department of Public Health and the Public Defender Service Corporation and Guam Legal Services have been in talks to create an Elder Law Center within the auspices of the Public Defender's

grants reserved or those populations—will be uniquely situated to fill the gaps in

legal services for the vulnerable, underserved, and under-represented members of

1 Office. The center would be funded by an existing \$190,000 federal grant meant to

2 provide legal services to the elderly. Public Health reports there are over 400

3 manåmko' who are currently awaiting legal services that this grant could provide. I

4 Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that governmental and non-profit corporations, including

5 the Corporation, Guam Legal Services Corporation, and the Micronesian Legal

Services Corporation, are ready, willing, and able to provide services to qualified

individuals with funding from this grant.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that in order to effectuate this service, the enabling language of the Public Defender Service Corporation must be amended to clarify that, notwithstanding any existing moratoriums or existing law, the Corporation is able to apply for, receive and administer grants and subgrants and also enter into intra-governmental and inter-governmental agreements, including but not limited to grants to provide protective orders and legal services for the elderly. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that our manåmko', the bedrock of our community, deserve quality legal services that could be duly provided by the hard-working and diligent staff of the Public Defender Service Corporation, whose express mission already includes the representation of people who are unable to afford an attorney in private practice.

Section 2. 12 GCA § 11105 is hereby amended to read:

"§ 11105. Same: Civil Matters. The Corporation shall render legal aid and assistance to those persons in Guam, who, under rules established by the Corporation, are in need of legal assistance and representation and who are unable to afford an attorney in private practice. The Corporation shall not compete with attorneys engaged in the private practice of law in Guam accept fee generating cases and shall give legal assistance in civil matters only to those who would otherwise not receive such assistance. The Corporation may apply for, receive and administer grants, subgrants or enter into intra-governmental and inter-governmental

1 agreements to provide legal services to individuals from vulnerable, underserved. 2 and under-represented groups, including but not limited to the elderly, victims of violence, individuals with disabilities, individuals and families of low income, and 3 members of ethnic or sexual or gender minorities, as defined pursuant to local or 4 federal laws, regulations, or guidelines. The Corporation is authorized to comply 5 6 with the requirements of the federal grant, subgrant, intra-governmental and inter-7 governmental agreement to include representation to individuals who may qualify for services pursuant to the terms of the federal grant, subgrant, intra-governmental 8 9 and inter-governmental agreement.
