AN ACT TO AMEND § 1101.5(m) AND ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (e) TO § 1102.8, BOTH OF CHAPTER 1, GARR, RELATIVE ARTICLE 1. TITLE 26, **INCREASING EMERGENCY** AND **TEMPORARY** SHELTER CAPACITY FOR **CHILDREN** PLACED UNDER THE PROTECTIVE CUSTODY OF CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 **Section 1.** Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds 3 that pursuant to § 13302 of Chapter 13, Title 19, Guam Code Annotated, the Child Protective Services (CPS) of the Bureau of Social Services, Department of Public 4 5 Health and Social Services (DPHSS), shall assume protective custody of a child 6 without a court order and without consent of the child's family regardless of whether 7 the child's family is absent if, in the discretion of such police officer, Child 8 Protective Services social worker or physician, the child is in such circumstances or condition that the child's continuing in the custody or care of the person responsible 9 10 for the child's welfare presents a situation of harm or threatened harm to the child. 11 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the rising numbers of children placed in the protective custody of CPS and limited number of licensed foster care homes 12 to provide emergency or temporary shelter presents a challenge to the protective 13

- placement of children. CPS has recently reported 270 children in foster care, 12
- 2 children in emergency children shelters, and 35 children waiting for foster
- 3 placement. Furthermore, a Group Child Care Home or facility is limited in
- 4 occupancy and capacity to at least seven (7) children, and not more that twelve (12)
- 5 children, during all or part of a twenty-four hour period.
- 6 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that DPHSS will soon complete construction of
- 7 the \$14 million federally funded, I Guma Mina'ase, "House of Mercy," a 7,000
- 8 square feet temporary facility planned by DPHSS and the Rigålu Foundation, as a
- 9 temporary home for children waiting to be placed in foster care.
- 10 It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to support the increasing need for
- shelter for children placed in the protective custody of CPS by authorizing the
- 12 Director of the Department of Public Health And Social Services, to grant a waiver
- 13 allowing Group Child Care Homes to exceed the maximum capacity of twelve (12)
- 14 children, for the protective placement of a child determined to be in a situation of
- harm or threatened harm. Nothing in this bill is intended to lessen federal mandates
- 16 or child to caretaker ratios.
- Section 2. § 1101.5(m) of Chapter 1, Article 1, Title 26, Guam
- 18 Administrative Rules and Regulations, is *amended* to read:
- "(m) Group eChild eCare hHome means a home or facility which
- provides child care for at least seven (7), and not more than twelve (12)
- 21 children, during all or part of a twenty-four (24) hour day. The Director may
- waive the maximum capacity of twelve (12) children for a Group Child Care
- 23 Home for the emergency or temporary placement of children in the
- 24 <u>protective custody of the Child Protective Services."</u>
- Section 3. A new subsection (e) is hereby *added* to § 1102.8 of Chapter 1,
- 26 Article 1, Title 26, Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations, to read:

1	"(e) The Director may waive the maximum capacity of twelve (12)
2	children for a Group Child Care Home for the emergency or temporary
3	placement of children in the protective custody of the Child Protective
4	Services."
5	Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to
6	any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such
7	invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be
8	given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
9	provisions of this Act are severable.
