1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:								
2	Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.								
3	I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the current law permits preference points to								
4	be added to applicant scores in both initial and subsequent applications for								
5	government of Guam positions.								
6	It is the intent of I Liheslatura to permit the use of preference points in only								
7	initial applications for employment in order to establish a fair selection process								
8	within in the government of Guam.								
9	Section 2. § 4104(b) of Chapter 4, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated is hereby								
10	amended to read:								
11	"(b) The points added to an applicant's passing score shall be added								
12	upon if the applicant receives a minimum passing score or higher upon initial								
13	and subsequent applications for employment only."								
14	Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any								
15	person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall								
16	not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without
