AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION 12(m) OF §715, CHAPTER 7 OF TITLE 1, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE GUAM DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION'S USE OF EASTER AND CHRISTMAS BREAKS AS MAKE-UP DAYS IN THE SCHOOL CALENDAR.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings. I Mina'Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan
- 3 Guahan finds that many school districts within the United States address the issue
- 4 of lost school days due to inclement weather and other causes by incorporating
- 5 designated inclement weather make-up days into the school calendar instead of

arbitrarily shortening scheduled Christmas and Easter breaks, thus disrupting the plans of the educators and the families of students for off-island travel during those periods. Inasmuch as the public school system is constrained by only a minimum requirement of one hundred eighty (180) instructional days that have to be completed within thirty (30) days following the end of the calendared school year, the Guam Department of Education clearly has the flexibility to adopt a similar system, as is the case in other jurisdictions. To facilitate the adoption of such a school calendar, *I Mina Trentai Tres Na Liheslaturan Guahan* further finds that the parameters for the school calendar should be defined further in this regard.

**Section 2.** Subsection 12(m) of §715 (Words and Terms Defined: Significance of Words), Chapter 7 of Title 1, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

"(m) at least one hundred eighty (180) instructional days or its equivalence including make-up days each school year with school years ending *no later than* thirty (30) days following the end of the calendared school year. Scheduled Easter and Christmas breaks *shall not* be included in make-up days; and"
