AN ACT TO AMEND § 77302 OF ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 77, AND §§ 90105(C), 90107, 90108(A), 90109, AND 90114 OF CHAPTER 90, TITLE 10 GCA, AND § 3401.1(H) OF CHAPTER 3, TITLE 16 GCA; TO ADD NEW §§ 90109.1, 90109(C), AND 90105(A)(13), AND REPEAL § 90109(A)(4), ALL OF CHAPTER 90, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EXPANDING THE **SMOKING** REGULATIONS OF THE NATASHA PROTECTION ACT OF 2005; TO PROVIDING FOR **INCREASED ENFORCEMENT: AND TO PROVIDING** FOR ENFORCEMENT TRAINING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. § 90109 of Chapter 90, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is

3 hereby *amended* to read:

1	"§ 90109.	Enforcement.
2	(a)	This Chapter may be enforced by:
3		(1) any peace officer as defined by 8 GCA 5.55;
4		(2) any employee of the Department of Public Health and
5	Socia	al Services when authorized in writing by the Director of Public
6	Healt	th and Social Services to enforce the provisions of this Chapter;
7		(3) any employee of the Guam Environmental Protection
8	Agen	icy when authorized in writing by the Administrator of the Guam
9	Envi	ronmental Protection Agency to enforce the provisions of this
10	Chap	oter;
11		(4) a Citizen Assisted Police Enforcement (CAPE) volunteer,
12	as pr	rovided pursuant to § 77302 of Article 3, Chapter 77, Title 10,

14		(5) all security officers employed by the government of
15	Guar	n, or performing security work for the government of Guam or
16	empl	loyed by private entity pursuant to their employer's contract, for

include compliance with the Natasha Protection Act, and who have

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been duly trained by a qualified government identified entity for the execution of such responsibilities.

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(b) The enforcement of this Chapter *shall* be undertaken subject to the provisions of 8 GCA Chapter 25."

5 Section 2. A new Subsection (c) is *added* to § 90109 of Chapter 90, Title
6 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"(c) The Director of a government of Guam agency, authority,
department or instrumentality, by whatever name, both autonomous and line
agencies, *shall* be authorized to delegate the authority and responsibility to
an employee to additionally serve and function as a designated no-smoking
enforcement officer for the purpose of ensuring compliance with this
Chapter in and around a government facility."

Section 3. A new § 90109.1 is hereby *added* to Chapter 90 of Title 10,
Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§ 90109.1. Enforcement Training. (a) The Bureau of Community
Health Services of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, in
conjunction with the Peace Project of the Guam Behavioral Health and
Wellness Center and the Guam Police Department, *shall* develop the
minimum criteria for a basic training program for private security personnel,
as provided pursuant to Items (7) and (8) of § 90109(a) of this Chapter,
which *shall*, at a minimum, provide for:

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(1) an understanding of 10 GCA Chapter 90;

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(2) the proper issuance of smoking violation citations;

24 (3) obtaining a certificate demonstrating the completion of a
25 required course of instruction and training that includes training in
26 measures to avoid dangerous confrontations with violators of this
27 Section; and

(4) other basic training deemed appropriate for safe and proper enforcement.

(b) The training program criteria developed by the Bureau of Community Health Services of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, in conjunction with the Peace Project of the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center and the Guam Police Department pursuant to this Section, *shall* be submitted to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for informational purposes sixty (60) days prior to the date of implementation."

9 Section 4. § 77302 of Article 3, Chapter 77, Title 10, Guam Code
10 Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:

"§ 77302. Volunteers.

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Pursuant to § 3401.1(h) of Article 4, Chapter 3 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, the Chief of Police is authorized to recruit volunteers to assist the Guam Police Department in the enforcement of the accessible parking and littering laws, and the Natasha Protection Act of 2005 relative to the regulation of smoking activities pursuant to Chapter 90 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated. In addition to these duties, the Chief of Police shall authorize the use of volunteers to patrol the school campuses of the Guam Department of Education during non-school hours. The volunteers shall take no enforcement action during their patrol of the school campuses, and shall notify the police of suspicious activity or crimes in progress. The Superintendent of Education shall cooperate with the Chief of Police to implement this Section.

The Chief of Police is further authorized to recruit volunteers to assist the Guam Police Department with traffic direction, security, and crowd control for events such as, but not limited to, the Guam Ko'ko' Road Race, the Guam-Micronesia Island Fair, and the Liberation Day Parade, Volunteers are required to obtain a certificate from the Chief of Police

1 demonstrating the completion of a required course of instruction and training 2 that includes training relative to traffic direction and crowd control." Section 5. A new Item (13) is added to § 90105(a), Prohibition of 3 4 Smoking in Public Places, Chapter 90, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read: 5 "(13) Bars, except as provided pursuant to § 90107(b) of this Chapter. The enforcement of this Item shall become effective January 1, 6 2017." $\overline{7}$ 8 Section 6. § 90105(c) of Chapter 90, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is 9 amended to read: 10 Smoking may be permitted within twenty (20) feet of the "(c) 11 entrance or exit of a public place only if such smoking area is an open 12 outdoor patio contiguous to the public place and is controlled by the 13 proprietor or management of the public place. This Subsection shall not apply to a location which 14 (1)15 would place the smoking area within twenty (20) feet of the public 16 entrance of another public place not controlled by the proprietor or 17 management. This Subsection *shall not* apply to government of Guam 18 (2)19 agencies and facilities, which shall comply with the twenty (20) feet 20 prohibition pursuant to 10 GCA § 90105(a)." 21 Section 7. § 90107 of Chapter 90, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is 22 amended to read: 23 ****\$ 90107.** Where Smoking Not Regulated. 24 (a)Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Chapter, the 25 following areas shall not be subject to the smoking restrictions of this 26 Chapter: 27 private residences, except when used as a child care (1)28facility or health care facility;

1 (2)hotel and motel rooms rented to guests; 2 retail tobacco stores; and (3)a private enclosed office work place occupied exclusively 3 (4)4 by one (1) or more smokers. 5 (b)The A.B. Won Pat Guam International Airport Authority is the only facility, pursuant to Board action, that may provide a separate, fully 6 7 enclosed non-service room, where beverages and food are not allowed, for 8 smoking, provided it shall be segregated and adequately ventilated with a 9 smoke ventilation device for the size of the room pursuant to § 90103 apart 10 from the main bar where service is provided. In addition, an air curtain shall be placed above the entrance and exit doors of the room to minimize the 11 release of smoke into other areas of the facility." 12 13 Section 8. Subsection (h) of § 3401.1 of Chapter 3, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read: 14 15 "(h) Volunteers Authorized to Issue Citations. The Chief of Police shall recruit volunteers who desire to assist the Guam Police Department in 16 17 the enforcement of this Section. The volunteer shall: be at least eighteen (18) years of age; 18 (1)19 (2)be a citizen of the United States and a resident of Guam; 20 (3)not have been convicted of a felony or crime of family 21 violence: 22 (4)certificate from Chief of Police obtain a the 23 demonstrating the completion of a required course of instruction and 24 training that includes training in measures to avoid dangerous 25 confrontations with violators of this Section. In addition, training shall include the enforcement of litter control laws and the Natasha 26 27 Protection Act pursuant to 10 GCA Chapter 90. The course of

- 1 instruction and training shall be at no cost to the volunteer. Retired "uniformed personnel" are exempted from this Subsection; and 2 satisfy any other qualifications and requirements 3 (5)4 established by the Chief of Police." § 90114 of Chapter 90, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is 5 Section 9. 6 amended to read: 7 ****8 90114.** Prohibition of Smoking in a Vehicle When a Child is 8 Present. 9 (a) Smoking is prohibited in a motor vehicle if a child who is 10 seventeen (17) years of age or younger or a pregnant woman is present in the 11 vehicle, regardless of whether the vehicle is moving or stationary. A person who is in violation of Subsection (a) shall, upon 12 (b)13 conviction thereof, be subject to a maximum fine of One Hundred Dollars 14 (\$100.00) for a first offense. Alternatively, the offender may plead guilty to 15 the offense and remit a fine of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). 16 A person who is in violation of Subsection (a) shall, upon (c)17 conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of no less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and no more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for a second 18 19 offense. The fine shall not be suspended by the court for second or 20subsequent offenses. Alternatively, the offender may plead guilty to the 21offense and remit a fine of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00). 22 (d)A person who is in violation of Subsection (a) shall, upon 23 conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of no less than Two Hundred Dollars 24 (\$200.00) and no more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for a third 25 offense, and for each additional violation thereafter. Alternatively, the 26 offender may plead guilty to the offense and remit a fine of Five Hundred 27Dollars (\$500.00).
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1 2 (e) Enforcement of this Section by a local law enforcement officer shall be conducted whenever a violation is witnessed.

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(f) Three (3) or more violations of this Section may be used as a basis for or evidence of child abuse or neglect.

5 (g) All fines paid, upon a conviction pursuant to a violation of this 6 § 90114, shall be deposited in the Guam Cancer Trust Fund (P.L. 30-80, 7 codified in Title 11, Chapter 26, Guam Code Annotated, as amended), and 8 shall be expended pursuant to applicable law and regulations pertaining to 9 the Fund."

Section 10. § 90109(a)(4) of Chapter 90, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated is
hereby *repealed*.

Section 11. § 90108(a), Posting of Signs, of Chapter 90, Title 10, Guam
Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

14 "(a) "Smoking" or "No Smoking" signs, whichever are appropriate, 15 with letters of not less than one inch $(1^{"})$ in height or the international "No 16 Smoking" symbol (consisting of a pictorial representation of a burning 17 cigarette enclosed in a red circle with a red bar across it) shall be clearly and 18 conspicuously posted in every building and within twenty (20) feet of the 19 entrance or exit of a public place where smoking is regulated by this Chapter by the owner, operator, manager or other person having control of such 20 21building or other place."

Section 12. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall* not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
