AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (f) TO §75101; TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (c) (3) TO §75107 AND TO ADD A NEW §75121 OF 21 GCA CHAPTER 75 RELATIVE TO THE DESIGNATION OF LANDS FOR THE CULTIVATION OF TRADITIONAL HERBAL MEDICINAL PLANTS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds

development has continually eroded the native habitat of plants which are

3 used by our suruhanas and suruhanus for the production of the medicines in

4 the practice of their healing art. Without intervention, these increasing rare

5 plants will eventually become extinct and along with it, the most treasured

6 formulas of native Chamorro medicines.

I Liheslaturan Guahan further finds one must devote many years

apprenticing under a traditional suruhana or suruhanu learning different

varieties of plants and their medicinal properties. During their training they

- 1 must acquire the knowledge of the seasons and location where each variety of
- 2 herbs germinate.
- 3 I Liheslaturan Guahan intends to reserve suitable land and make it
- 4 available to interested individuals or organizations for the cultivation of
- 5 plants use by *suruhanu's* in the production of their herbal medicines. One
- 6 parcel shall be made available in the northern part of the island and a second
- 7 parcel located in the southern part, which are suitable for cultivation. These
- 8 parcels shall be designated as "Hatdin Åmot Chamorro".
- 9 Section 2. A new subsection (f) of 21 G.C.A. §75101 Chapter 75 is
- 10 hereby added to read:
- "(f) The term Suruhana or Suruhanu means an individual who heals
- 12 through massage and the use of traditional Chamorro remedies that include
- the use of root, leaves, bark, plants, and grass and incorporates the cultural
- 14 healing process."
- Section 3. A new subsection (c) (3) of 21 G.C.A. §75107 Chapter 75 is
- 16 hereby added to read:
- "(c) (3) The Commission shall designate and make available two parcels
- of land of approximately 4000 sq. M. each, one in the Northern part of the
- island and one in the Southern part of the island for the purpose of cultivating
- 20 herbal plants."
- Section 4. A new §75121 of 21 G.C.A. Chapter 75 is hereby added to
- 22 read:
- 23 "§75121. The establishment of "Hatdin Åmot Chamorro"

1 (a) The Chamorro Land Trust Commission is hereby directed to	parcel

- 2 the designated lots into four parcels or into parcels of 100 feet by 100 feet, with
- access to each lot, for the establishment of the "Hatdin Åmot Chamorro"."
- 4 (b) The Chamorro Land Trust Commission is hereby directed to
- 5 establish the criteria, application, and operational procedures which should
- 6 include at least one, but not limited to:
- 7 1.) Qualification for *Hatdin Åmot Chamorro*, the applicant:
- 8 (i) Must be an individual eligible for residential lease of Chamorro Land
- 9 Trust Land; or
- (ii) A non-profit organization whose charter includes the advancement
- of Chamorro traditional healing or medicine, or the advancement of
- 12 Chamorro heritage and culture and registered with the Department of
- 13 Revenue and Taxation; and
- (iii) Must be a Suruhana or Suruhanu, apprentice, or student of
- 15 traditional Chamorro medicines.
- 16 Preference shall be given to an applicant who meets more than one of the
- 17 qualifications above.
- 18 (2) Requirement for *Hatdin Åmot Chamorro*, the applicant:
- (i) Must submit a proposal for the usage of parceled lot and a list of
- 20 plants to be cultivated."

Section 5. Rules and Regulation. Upon enactment of this Act, the

- 1 Chamorro Land Trust Commission shall have one hundred eighty (180) days
- 2 to promulgate rules and regulations for "Hatdin Åmot Chamorro" pursuant to
- 3 the Adjudication Administrative Law.
- Section 6. Severability. If any of the provisions of this Act or the
- 5 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
- 6 invalidity shall not affect any other provision or application of this Act which
- 7 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
- 8 end the provisions of this Act are severable.
