AN ACT TO ESTABLISH PROGRAM PROCUREMENT GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES RELATIVE TO THE CONTRACTUAL REQUIREMENTS OF THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Statement and Intent. I' Liheslaturan Guahan finds there is a need to streamline and facilitate the procurement procedures that govern the outlay of funds made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 ("AARA") to provide full compliance and to meet federally mandated fiduciary requirements. The people of Guam stand to receive millions of dollars in ARRA funding for the enhancement of public facilities, improvement of the education system, installation of new technology to meet local, national and world wide environmental standards and qualified capital improvements which will improve the quality of life for all our community.

I' Liheslaturan Guahan further finds having assessed the government of Guam's present capacity and historical ability to administer and maintain an effective system to manage federal grant awards of such magnitude and to meet the regulatory and financial reporting mandates of this as well as other federal programs that benefit Guam, it is necessary and prudent to streamline and facilitate the system of procuring contractual services related to the outlay of ARRA funds by the government of Guam.

I' Liheslaturan Guahan further finds given the compressed timelines and stringent management and audit regulations that accompany the receipt and expenditure of ARRA funds, it is necessary to assist the Administration to meet respective administrative and

fiduciary obligations while ensuring full accountability of any ARRA funds expended for the benefit of Guam with the ultimate objective of maintaining Guam's eligibility to participate in such programs in the future and to restore faith and confidence in the government's ability to fulfill and comply with all federal and local regulatory guidelines and mandates that accompany the acceptance of such grants.

Therefore, it is the *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to establish program procurement guidelines and procedures for contractual requirements to meet the AARA.

Section 2. American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Program Contractual and Procurement Authority. The Lieutenant Governor of Guam is hereby granted the *program contracting and procuring authority* for the government of Guam with specific regard to programs and projects funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 ("AARA"). This mandate shall remain in effect throughout the full term of the present ARRA grant period awarded in Fiscal Year 2009 or any continuation thereof or, for subsequent grant award(s) to Guam under the ARRA.

Section 3. Authorization. The Lieutenant Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to allocate, transfer, expend and or direct resources under the charge of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor of Guam and the Guam State Clearinghouse including budgeted operating funds, staffing, materials and supplies, office space, equipment and any related logistic support and services required to fulfill the scope, purpose and intent of this Act. The Office of the Lieutenant Governor is designated the sole interim contracting, procuring and managing entity authorized to report, advertise, administer, solicit, review and grant contractual awards of the government of Guam funded under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

Section 4. Establishment and Composition of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Contracting Board. (1) The Lieutenant Governor of Guam shall establish the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 ("ARRA") Contracting Board ("Board") which shall consist of seven (8) regular voting members and two (2) alternate members who are allowed to cast a vote only in the event a regular voting member is/are absent. The Board shall be comprised of members from the following entities:

a) The Lieutenant Governor;

1 b) Representative of the Guam Education Policy Board; 2 c) Superintendent of Education or his/her designee; 3 d) Chief Engineer of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency; 4 e) Attorney General of Guam or his/her designee; 5 f) Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation or his/her designee; 6 g) Chief Engineer of the Department of Public Works; 7 h) Chief Procurement Officer of the government of Guam; 8 i) Director of the Guam State Clearinghouse (Alternate); 9 j) Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research or his/her 10 designee (Alternate); 11 (2) Duties and Responsibilities Granted. Notwithstanding any other provision of 12 law, the scope of authority, duties, and responsibilities granted in this Section shall be for 13 the purpose of: 14 a) Program administration and management of ARRA funds awarded to Guam in 15 2009 or thereafter, in accordance with applicable local and federal laws; 16 b) Announcement, solicitation and awards of bids for qualified programs and 17 projects funded through the ARRA of 2009 and any continuation of ARRA 18 programs thereafter; 19 c) Receipt and protection of sealed bids, request for proposals (RFP) and request 20 for interest (RFI), request for quotations (RFO) and any other government of 21 Guam solicitation in accordance with established local procurement rules and 22 regulations and ARRA procedures and guidelines to ensure fair and lawful 23 procurement practices and compliance with federal and local laws; 24 d) Developing periodic reports on expenditures, encumbrances, balances, fund 25 reallocation and any other financial transaction or activity affecting the status 26 of ARRA funds while insuring compliance with ARRA requirements; 27 e) Maintaining project status reports, financial status reports and documentation 28 of financial transactions affecting the fund balance(s) of grant accounts for 29 audit and project close-out requirements for corresponding grant award 30 year(s);

f) Preparation of quarterly financial report(s) on ARRA funded projects and programs for submission to *I' Liheslaturan Guahan*;

The Board shall meet as necessary to comply with this Section. The Lieutenant Governor of Guam shall act as the interim AARA Chief Contracting Officer as stated in Section 5 of this Act until such time a person is designed to this position.

Section 5. Establishment and Recruitment of the Chief Contracting Officer.

The Lieutenant Governor of Guam is authorized to establish an unclassified position to be designated as the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 ("ARRA") Chief Contracting Officer who shall provide administrative and management support to the Board, as stated in Section 4 of this Act. Such ARRA Chief Contracting Officer shall posses the following combination of skill and experience:

- a) No less than five years of experience in administering and managing capital improvement programs funded by federal, state, municipal, or private funds;
- b) Ability to develop and administer contracting and procurement procedures for use and adoption by the ARRA Contracting Authority;
- c) Ability and experience in preparing or coordinating the preparation of financial and other required reports for ARRA programs and projects as mandated by federal, state and local authorities;
- d) Contracting experience in federal (U.S.Government) and government of Guam funded CIP and sufficient knowledge of procurement practices and regulations applicable to both;
- e) Ability to administer and develop public education and information program, advertising, business relations, media announcement and public relations campaign to promote the ARRA programs of the government of Guam;

Section 6. Appropriation. The sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of the Lieutenant Governor of Guam to partly defray the costs of implementing the provisions of this Act and shall be used for funding the salary and benefits of the Chief Contracting Officer, contractual services, supplies, materials and other operating needs of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Contracting Board.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon enactment. The designation of a American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Chief 2 Contracting Officer shall become effective within Sixty (60) days upon enactment of this Act. Section 8. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any 5 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not 7 affect other provisions or applications of this Law, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

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
