AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (C) OF §4104 OF TITLE 17 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE ADOPTION OF TEXTBOOKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Subsection (c) of §4104 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read:

"(c) The Board shall establish a standing committee of the Board called the Textbook Selection Committee (the Committee), which shall be chaired by a member of the appointed by the chairperson of the Board and shall consist of four (4) additional members, who may or may not be members of the Board appointed by the chairperson of the Committee. The chairperson shall make appointments from both the public and the private school sectors. The Board shall also establish two subcommittees, one of which shall be composed of educators from the public schools and the other of educators from the private schools. Each subcommittee shall examine textbooks and make recommendations thereon to the Committee, which will then make

recommendations for adoption or disapproval of the proposals to the Board. 1 Textbooks and other instructional materials adopted for each grade and 2 subject field shall come from a multiple listing to meet the varying ability 3 levels of elementary and secondary students in the territory. The Board shall 4 also establish a textbook adoption calendar setting forth the subjects or 5 courses for each grade level that are to be selected and ordered each year, on a 6 rotation basis, not to exceed seven (7) years for Science, Health, Consumer 7 Family Science, and Social Studies and not to exceed ten (10) years for 8 Language Arts, Math, Fine Arts, and Business Education of continuous use for 9 any one (1) textbook, and the critical dates to be met each year. In addition, 10 the Board shall establish a similar but separate calendar for the textbook 11 ordering process which will ensure that new and replacement textbooks are 12 available in the classroom for the opening of school each year." 13
