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AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE UNIFIED PAY SCHEDULE OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Definition. For the purpose of this Act, the term Agency shall mean any department, agency, autonomous, non-autonomous, semi-autonomous, line, public corporation, instrumentality, Office of the Public Auditor, etc. within the Executive Branch to include the Judiciary of Guam.

6 Section 2. Moratorium on Government Of Guam Position Classification, 7 Compensation and Benefits Studies. There shall be a moratorium within all government 8 of Guam on any and all studies related to government of Guam position classification, 9 compensation and benefits, effective upon enactment of this legislation. The Department 10 of Administration is exempted from this moratorium.

Section 3. Mandating the Transmittal of Position Classification, Compensation, and Benefits Studies. Any agency of the Government of Guam that has undertaken and have completed a study (whether implemented or not), on position classification, compensation, and benefits shall forward their report (including findings, implementation procedures and supporting documents in written as well as electronic format if it exists) to the Department of Administration within thirty (30) days of enactment of this legislation.

17 Section 4. Responsibility of the Department of Administration. The Department 18 of Administration shall consider the findings of the various studies in Section 3, with the 19 findings of the Government-Wide Position Classification, Compensation, and Benefits 20 Study as described in the Department of Administration Circular No. 2009-013. Section 5. Implementation of Revised Unified Pay Schedule. Within thirty (30)
days upon completion of the Government Wide Position Classification, Compensation, and
Benefits Study, the Department of Administration shall transmit the findings to the Guam
Legislature for final approval and implementation.
