AN ACT TO FACILITATE EARLY VOTING FOR GUAM'S ELECTORATE BY ESTABLISHING REGIONAL VOTING SITES OR EXPANDING EXISTING EARLY VOTING ACCOMMODATIONS, BY REQUIRING THE GOVERNOR TO IMMEDIATELY AUTHORIZE AND RELEASE UP TO 2010 SEP 24 BUDGET NINETY DAYS OF THE **FY-2011 APPROPRIATION** FOR THE **GUAM ELECTION** COMMISSION SPECIFICALLY FOR THIS PURPOSE; AND 100 TO PROVIDE FOR REGIONAL EARLY VOTING SITES IN ò **FUTURE ELECTIONS.** S

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent: *I Liheslaturan Guahan*finds that in the days before the September 4th primary election, there was a
record 3,200 plus early voters who cast in-office votes at the Guam Election
Commission's office in GCIC building in Hagåtna.

I Liheslaturan Guahan further finds that as we approached the primary, the lines became considerably longer, sometimes requiring an extended period of time for many to vote, and that this may have discouraged some from voting. This occurred notwithstanding the

excellent efforts of the staff of the Guam Election Commission (GEC)
relative to accommodating early voters in the primary.

It is reasonable to anticipate that an even greater number of voters 3 may wish to participate in the early voting process as we approach the 4 November General Election. Additionally, the date of the General Election 5 coincides with All Souls Day, and many may wish to vote early so as to be 6 able to spend the day fulfilling *obligations* with family members. 7 This situation can only be addressed through the expansion of early voting 8 opportunities. For example, but not necessarily limited to, a northern site 9 to accommodate the villages of Dededo and Yigo, and a strategically 10 located southern site. This type of expanded program would significantly 11 increase the number of early voters, and thereby increase voter 12 participation overall. 13

It is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to accommodate the people of 14 Guam by expanding early voter opportunities through the establishment of 15 at least two (2) regional voting sites in northern and southern Guam, 16 and/or the expansion of existing early voting accommodations, for the 17 purpose of absentee voting in the 2010 General Election. The GEC's 18 headquarters in the GCIC building would continue to existing 19 accommodate early voting for any who may choose to vote there 20 regardless of their precinct, as well as manage the overall election process 21 island-wide. 22

It is further the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to insure that future
 elections provide for regional polling sites for absentee voting by requiring
 the establishment of such sites pursuant to law.

Section 2. Authorization to Transfer and Expend Funds for the 4 Establishment of Regional Voting Sites, and/or to expand existing 5 accommodations, for Absentee Voting in the 2010 General Election. If 6 determined to be practicable by the Guam Election Commission, and 7 notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Governor is hereby 8 required to immediately transfer and authorize the expenditure of up to 9 ninety (90) days of funding from the Fiscal Year 2011 funds budgeted for 10 the Guam Election Commission for the purpose of establishing at least two 11 (2) or more regional voting sites for the purpose of accommodating early 12 voters, and/or to expand existing early voter accommodations. The 13 regional voting sites would be in addition to GEC's existing headquarters 14 in the GCIC building which would continue to serve those wishing to vote 15 there, as well as manage the overall election process island-wide. 16

Section 3. A new §4101.1 is added to Chapter 4 of Title 3, Guam
Code Annotated, to read:

nnotated, to read: *"§* 4101.1. Designation of Regional Absentee Early Polling

Places. The Commission shall, *not less than* thirty (30) days *prior to* the date set for any regular election, designate, announce and publish the Official Regional Polling Sites where the ballots for Absent

Voting, as provided pursuant to Chapter 10 of Title 3 Guam Code Annotated, are to be cast in such election. In the case of a runoff election, the Regional Polling Sites shall be the same as in the election precipitating the need for a runoff, *unless* determined otherwise by the Commission."

Section 4. A new §10102.1 is added to Chapter 10 of Title 3, Guam
Code Annotated, to read:

"§10102.1. Regional Voting Sites for the Conduct of Absent Voting. In addition to the conduct of absentee voting at the
Commission's main office, the Commission shall additionally
provide for the conduct of absentee voting at a minimum of two (2)
regional voting sites. At least one (1) site shall be situated in northern
Guam, and one (1) site in southern Guam. If practicable, additional
sites may be established by the Commission."

15 Section 5. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment16 into law.
