GUÅHAN: 2 3 WHEREAS, on July 1, 1958, in Washington, D.C., Dr. Ethel Percy Andrus and a group of founding members formed the National Retired 4 5 Teacher's Association (NRTA), which was transformed into the American 6 Association of Retired Persons (AARP), and was established as a national 7 organization representing the interests of older U.S. citizens; and WHEREAS, Dr. Andrus, the Association's first (1st) President, 8 9 approved the application for recognition of the first (1st) AARP chapter in 10 Youngstown, Arizona, in September 1960. Twenty-six (26) years later, in 11 1984 the Guam Chapter 4837, AARP, Inc., was organized, and was 12 chartered in 1994 with over three thousand (3,000) members to date; and 13 WHEREAS, AARP stresses the importance of community service, an active and useful life, self-actualization, and development. AARP has 14 15 continued to develop networks to form coalitions within the worldwide 16 aging community, promoting the well-being of older persons 17 internationally through advocacy, education and service; and 18 WHEREAS, the Chapter's mission is to represent AARP at the local level, providing a link between members, communities, 19 20 Association's programs and services, whose leadership and commitment to 21 volunteerism is an invaluable resource in strengthening the Association

and making communities better places to live and work for all people; and

WHEREAS, the Chapter's goals and objectives are set across a broad wide range of functions, including, community service, leadership, communication, recruitment, fellowship, advocacy and education; and

WHEREAS, AARP began to standardize the various operating rules and procedures for its chapters in the mid 1960's, and in 1965, the AARP Board of Directors developed the AARP Chapter By-Laws, an important step in unifying the organization into a viable national association; and

WHEREAS, today, AARP is a dynamic force in being the most successful and acknowledged organization in the United States for positive social change, in delivering on the promise to each member in helping members make their own choices and reaching their goals and dreams, in making the most of life after the age of fifty (50), and in being a world leader on the issue of global aging; and

WHEREAS, Guam Chapter 4837, AARP, Inc., has been a distinguished recipient of the Annual AARP Chapter Community Service Award, in sponsoring political debates, and in making the AARP Medicare Supplemental Plan 1 and the AARP Life Insurance Plan available to members of the Guam Chapter 4837, AARP, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, AARP now has offices in each of the fifty (50) states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Together, states and chapters provide a highly visible, positive image of the Association regionally and locally, working in tandem to carry out AARP's advocacy, education, and service responsibilities; now, therefore, be it
