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WHEREAS, the Training Program for Federal TRIO Programs (TRIO Training Programs) was authorized by the 1976 education amendments of the Higher Education Act, as amended, to focus specifically on improving the design and administration of TRIO services; and is one of eight (8) TRIO Programs, exhibiting the commitment of the United States of America to providing educational opportunity to all eligible students, regardless of race, ethnicity, or other similar disadvantaged backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, the TRIO Training Programs provide funding to enhance the skills and expertise of Project Directors and staff in the different Federal TRIO Programs, to include annual training on student financial aid, general project management for new directors, legislative and regulatory requirements, the design and operation of model programs, and the use of educational technology, so that the project directors and staff can better serve and address the needs of participants in their particular geographical region and communities; and

WHEREAS, the University of Washington (UW) TRIO Training Programs, since it was first awarded funding in 1989, and under the leadership of Dr. Karen Morrell, continues to provide training and staff development to TRIO Programs throughout the United States, its territories and other insular areas; and

WHEREAS, the University of Washington (UW) TRIO Training Programs actively embrace new technologies to enhance its activities, as shown through its online TRIO Virtual Center, which provides resources,

tutorials and training modules; and its interactive TRIO Resources website, a 1

gateway for access to current and future online resources, including free tools 2

to help programs with its data collection and management; both of which are 3

accessible to all TRIO staff and students across geographical and political

boundaries; and 5

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WHEREAS, the University of Washington (UW) TRIO Training Programs' commitment to taking full advantage of the opportunities of today's technology is most prominent in its TRIO Quest Activities, an annual competition where TRIO students can submit entries in the photo essay, audio and video design, or web design categories; and

WHEREAS, the University of Washington (UW) TRIO Training Programs further affirm its pledge to meeting the specific needs of the various regional and local communities by conducting two (2) onsite trainings, namely, Priority #1 for Upward Bound programs and Priority #3 for all other TRIO Programs, in collaboration with the Pacific Islands' Chapter (PIC) of Western Association of Educational Opportunity Personnel (WESTOP), to be held on Guam from February 23 through 26, 2009, and which is open to all TRIO Programs, not just those from the Pacific region; and

WHEREAS, WESTOP is the umbrella organization for TRIO Programs from the states of Arizona, Nevada, and California, and the Pacific Islands, composed of programs from the state of Hawaii, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of Palau, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and American Samoa; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that I Mina' Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on 1 behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend the University of 2 Washington TRIO Training Programs for its invaluable service to the TRIO 3 Programs in our local and regional community, enabling them to further 4 address the needs of our islands' children as they graduate from high school 5 and continue on to complete a post-secondary education, and does further 6 especially commend Dr. Karen Morell, Director of the University of 7 Washington (UW) TRIO Training Programs, for her untiring efforts in 8 securing the approval from the U.S. Department of Education's Federal TRIO 9 Programs in Washington, D.
