## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

3 WHEREAS, "AmeriCorps Week 2009" is the time to salute the 4 AmeriCorps members, the Guam AmeriCorps Alumni Chapter, and the 5 Guam Volunteer Center, in partnership with the University of Guam, the military, the island community, and the Governor's Serve Guam!
 Commission, for the powerful impact their dedication and demonstrated
 action to our community, and public service by individuals, has on building a
 better, more livable community; and

5 WHEREAS, "AmeriCorps Week 2009" is the time to thank the many 6 community partners for their efforts recruiting, recognizing, encouraging and 7 motivating volunteers to continue to promote the ethic of service and 8 volunteering, since its creation in 1994, in our island community with the 9 motto "We're Counting On You!" to serve; and

WHEREAS, the U. S. Congress recently passed the Edward M. Kennedy
Serve America Act, a bipartisan legislation to reauthorize the Corporation for
National and Community Service and to engage more Americans in service,
including, a major expansion of AmeriCorps to focus on the critical national
issues of education, health, clean energy, veterans, and economic opportunity;
and

16 WHEREAS, the AmeriCorps national service program has proven to be 17 a highly effective way to engage Americans of all ages and backgrounds in 18 meeting a wide range of community needs, demonstrating the AmeriCorps 19 value as a powerful catalyst and force multiplier; and

20 WHEREAS, the current economic downturn means more Americans are 21 facing hardships, and volunteering and national service is needed now, more 22 than ever; and

WHEREAS, since 1994, six hundred eighty-seven (687) AmeriCorps 1 2 members from Guam have taken the AmeriCorps pledge "get things done for 3 America", after becoming members. They have served a total of seven hundred twenty-seven thousand seven hundred five (727,705) hours of 4 service, which helped improve the lives of our island's most vulnerable 5 strengthening our 6 by educational system, protecting citizens, our 7 environment, and contributing to our health, homeland security, public safety, and other unmet human needs; and as members, in return for their 8 9 service, have earned One Million Seven Hundred Fifty-one Thousand Five 10 Hundred Sixty-five Dollars (\$1,751,565) in Segal AmeriCorps Education 11 Awards, to further their own educational advancement at colleges and 12 universities; and

WHEREAS, AmeriCorps was designed to give a key role to state commissions in deciding where resources should be directed to meet state and local needs, such as, the state plan under the Governor's Serve Guam! Commission; and

WHEREAS, AmeriCorps members, after their term of service, remain engaged in our communities as volunteers, teachers, public servants and nonprofit leaders in disproportionately high levels, which has strengthened our island community through the support of the efforts of nonprofit, community, educational, faith-based, government and military community groups, and
