Relative to recognizing the American Cancer Society Guam Field Office for promoting cancer awareness through the "Relay For Life", and to commending the hardworking volunteers and corporate partners for coordinating, promoting and making this annual event a success.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*:

3 WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society's annual "Relay For Life" has 4 become one of the most successful charity events nationwide, and is 5 celebrating twenty-five (25) years of bringing hope to communities 6 everywhere, and saving lives; and

WHEREAS, in May 1985, Dr. Gordy Klatt, a colorectal surgeon, spent a
grueling twenty-four (24) hours running and walking over eighty-three (83)
miles at Baker Stadium in Tacoma, Washington, thereby raising the first
Twenty-seven Thousand Dollars (\$27,000) for the fight against cancer; and

11 WHEREAS, in 2008, our Guam community continued the tradition of 12 helping in the fight against cancer, raising Three Hundred Seventy Nine 13 Thousand Dollars (\$379,000) with ninety-seven (97) teams, and celebrating the 14 lives of two hundred twelve (212) cancer survivors and their caregivers, who 15 participated in "Relay For Life 2008"; and

16 WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society's "Relay For Life" involves all 17 facets of the community throughout the nation, including, businesses, 18 government agencies, individuals, and youth groups with one goal: to 19 remember those who have lost the battle to cancer, to celebrate the brave men, 20 women, and children who have survived cancer, and to continue to fight for a 21 cure; and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society Guam Field Office is largely
 made up of volunteers, and the monies it raises are used for research,
 education, advocacy, and services to cancer patients; and

4 WHEREAS, the "Relay For Life" fundraising has allowed for 5 advancements in research, including, the mammogram and the pap smear 6 that exist today due to the work of American Cancer Society-funded research; 7 and

8 WHEREAS, funds raised through "Relay For Life" allow the American 9 Cancer Society to continue their work to educate adults and children on the 10 prevention and early detection of cancer, and to allow for cancer information 11 to be accessible twenty-four (24) hours a day at <u>www.cancer.org</u>, and 1-800-12 ACS-2345; and

WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society works to strengthen cancerrelated laws and regulations that benefit the entire community, such as, the
Natasha Protection Act, which bans smoking in public places; and

WHEREAS, funds raised through "Relay For Life" allow the Guam Field Office to provide ongoing support programs and services to patients diagnosed with cancer in Guam, including, but not limited to, transportation and lodging assistance, medical supplies, nutritional supplement drinks, and wigs and hats; and

WHEREAS, the success of the American Cancer Society's "Relay For
Life" is due to the Relay For Life Team Captains, teams, the hundreds of

community volunteers, and numerous corporate sponsors and benefactors,
 whose generous contributions help to lead our community toward a future
 where cancer will one day not be a threat to the lives of our friends and
 family; now, therefore, be it

5 **RESOLVED,** that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trenta Na* 6 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the 7 people of Guam, recognize and extend a heartfelt *Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to the 8 American Cancer Society Guam Field Office for promoting cancer awareness 9 through the annual "Relay For Life", for its dedication to finding a cure, for 10 honoring and celebrating cancer survivors, and for remembering those who 11 have lost their lives; and be it further

12 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on 13 Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and 14 that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Christina Noket, 15 Community Manager-Development of the American Cancer Society Guam 16 Field Office; and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
