1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:*

WHEREAS, Parsons Corporation is an engineering and construction firm, founded in 1944, and headquartered in Pasadena, California. Parsons Corporation fronts the \$3.4 Billion Dollars in revenues achieved in 2008 through a variety of projects carried out in the United States and internationally. The Corporation has
 twelve thousand (12,000) employees worldwide, all of whom report directly or
 indirectly to Mr. Charles L. "Chuck" Harrington, its Chairman and Chief Executive
 Officer; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Chuck Harrington graduated Magna Cum Laude with a 5 Bachelor's degree in Engineering from California Polytechnic State University in San 6 7 Luis Obispo, California. He also graduated with honors and holds a Master's degree in Business Administration from the Anderson School of Management at the 8 University of California Los Angeles (UCLA), with concentrations in Finance and 9 Marketing, and attended the Advanced Management Program at the Fuqua School of 10 Business at Duke University, Durham, North Carolina. He is a registered professional 11 mechanical engineer and a graduate of the Parsons Rotating Management Program; 12 and 13

WHEREAS, Mr. Chuck Harrington joined Parsons in 1982, working on a 14 variety of diverse programs in locations from Saudi Arabia to the North Slope of 15 16 Alaska, and in a broad range of markets from oil and gas to nuclear fuel reprocessing. He relocated in early 1991 from Pasadena, California, to Charlotte, North Carolina, 17 and took over sales to federal government organizations in the southeastern United 18 States. He later became Vice President and Program Manager of a multibillion-dollar 19 engineering and construction project at the United States Department of Energy's 20 Savannah River Site. Prior to his appointment in 2006 to the position of Executive 21 Vice President, Chief Financial Officer, and Treasurer, Mr. Harrington was the 22 founding President of Parsons Commercial Technology Group, one of Parsons' four 23 (4) global business units. He held a number of senior appointments before becoming 24 Chief Executive Officer at Parsons; and 25

WHEREAS, Mr. Chuck Harrington serves on the Boards of several 1 2 organizations, including, the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, the Los Angeles Sports Council, the California Science Center Foundation, the North Carolina 3 Blumenthal Performing Arts Center, and on two (2) of his alma maters – the Anderson 4 School of Management at UCLA and the California Polytechnic State University, San 5 6 Luis Obispo President's Cabinet. Mr. Harrington sponsored Parsons' support of Toastmasters International, a non-profit organization, and a world leader in helping 7 8 people become more competent and comfortable in front of an audience that now has 9 nearly two hundred fifty thousand (250,000) members in more than twelve thousand (12,000) clubs in one hundred six (106) countries, offering a proven and enjoyable 10 11 way to practice and hone communication and leadership skills; and

WHEREAS, Parsons Corporation began doing business on Guam in 1969, participating in a variety of work projects with reported gross revenues of \$12.9 Million Dollars and \$18.72 Million Dollars for fiscal years 2006 and 2007, respectively, as reported in the Deloitte & Touche, ASC Trust Corp. Top Companies in Micronesia survey in the November-December 2008 issue of *Guam Business* magazine; and

WHEREAS, in a May 25, 2009, interview with Guam's Marianas Business 18 19 Journal, Mr. Harrington noted that "Parsons has been an integral part of the 20 community on Guam for forty (40) years and in fact, Parsons first project on the island was in 1969, when the Corporation managed the Deep Water Terminal Program at the 21 then Commercial Port of Guam. Since then, Parsons have been involved in several 22 major infrastructure milestones on the island, including the A.B. Won Pat 23 International Airport in the 1970s and the 1990s, assisting in the implementation of 24 the Department of Public Works 2030 Transportation Plan, and now, supporting the 25

largest infrastructure investment ever made on Guam - the work associated with the
 United States Marine Corps relocation; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Robert Marks, Manager of Operations for Parsons Corporation on Guam, told the *Marianas Business Journal*, "For years, Parsons has demonstrated its commitment to Guam by supporting the local community in a variety of ways and by actively working to improve and enhance the island's infrastructure. Parsons prides themselves that they have had many successes during these years and look forward to celebrating many more moving forward". Mr. Marks serves as the Vice-President of the Guam Post of the Society of American Military Engineers; and

10 WHEREAS, Parsons' international projects range from commercial and 11 industrial work to facilities management for the Department of Defense and the 12 private sector, as well as, planning and execution in fields as varied as infrastructure 13 and data management; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Chuck Harrington acknowledges the support of his wife, Diane, and their three (3) children, Josclyn, Rhiena and Chase, throughout his career and continues his active involvement in community service on principles and values learned, and based on a foundation of responsibility, character, integrity, respect for others, and family commitment enhancing his spiritual, personal, and professional growth; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Chuck Harrington recognized the importance of good corporate citizenship in its places of business, stating - "As investments were made to the island's infrastructure, Parsons has invested in the community on Guam." Parsons is a member of the Guam Chamber of Commerce, the Chamber's Armed Forces Committee, the Guam Contractors' Association, and the Guam Post of the Society of American Military Engineers. From supporting Relay for Life, sponsoring the Guam Youth Football League, and supporting the rebuilding of the Guam Museum, Parsons gives back to the communities where the Corporation's employees live and work; now
 therefore, be it
