 of bilingual-bicultural and indigenous language and cultural instruction and
 activities; and

 to encourage and educate our children about their heritage, in an attempt to
 nurture them as the leaders of the future; and

4 WHEREAS, it is imperative that the members of PIBBA International 5 and PIBBA Local Chapters be acknowledged as the vanguards who have 6 dedicated their efforts to emphasizing the significance of perpetuating 7 indigenous languages and, by extension, the culture within their educational 8 systems and within their communities; and
