3 WHEREAS, Rear Admiral William D. French arrived on Guam in April of 2007 with his wife Monika, their son Thomas, and daughter Teressa, to 4 serve as the U.S. Defense Representative of Guam, the Commonwealth of the 5 Northern Mariana Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia, and the 6 Republic of Palau; as Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Marianas, and as 7 8 Commander, Joint Region Marianas; and 9 WHEREAS, Rear Admiral French graduated from Vanderbilt 10 University with a Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical Engineering, and was commissioned through the NROTC Program in May 1979; he earned a Master 11 12 of Science Degree from the Naval Postgraduate School in 1986, and a Master of Arts from the Naval War College in 1999; and 13 14 WHEREAS, as Submarine Officer and graduate of the Navy's Nuclear 15 Power Training, Rear Admiral French has served at sea on the USS SPADEFISH (SSN 668), as the Operations Officer on the USS SEA DEVIL (SSN 16 664), and as the Engineer on the USS TECUMSEH (SSBN 628). He served as 17 Executive Officer of the USS HELENA (SSN 725), and he commanded the USS 18 19 SALT LAKE CITY (SSN 716), homeported in San Diego, California; and 20 WHEREAS, while on shore duty, Rear Admiral French has served as the 21 Submarine Officer Community Manager at the Bureau of Naval Personnel; as

the Deputy Commander of Submarine Squadron ELEVEN; as the Chief of the

- 1 Strategy and Policy Division at the United States Strategic Command in
- 2 Omaha, Nebraska; as the Director, Submarine Officer Distribution and
- 3 Nuclear Propulsion Program Manager at the Bureau of Naval Personnel; and
- 4 he commanded Submarine Squadron THREE in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii.
- 5 During his Squadron command tour, all six (6) of the Squadron's submarines
- 6 deployed, five (5) of which conducted operations in direct support of
- 7 Operation IRAQI FREEDOM; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Rear Admiral French served in his first Flag Officer
- 9 assignment as Commander, Navy Region Northwest, from August 2005 to
- 10 April 2007, followed by his current assignment as Commander, Joint Region
- 11 Marianas, from April 2007 to July 2009, and he was recently selected for
- 12 promotion to Rear Admiral (Upper Half), and an assignment as Commander,
- 13 Navy Region Southwest, in August 2009; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Rear Admiral French's awards, among others, include the
- 15 Defense Superior Service Medal; three (3) awards of the Legion of Merit; three
- 16 (3) Meritorious Service Medals; four (4) Navy and Marine Corps
- 17 Commendation Medals; and two (2) Navy and Marine Corps Achievement
- 18 Medals; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Rear Admiral French executed and enhanced the Navy's
- 20 commitment to the preservation and promotion of Chamorro culture and
- 21 heritage through support of ongoing community programs, as well as, the
- 22 preservation and stewardship of numerous historic sites on Navy installations

1 throughout Guam, including, the location of the former Village of Sumay and

2 the Sumay Cemetery; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral French has embraced and has been embraced by the people of Guam, and has gained new relationships that have helped to foster better understanding between the military and island community, and oftentimes, his engagements consisted of not only formal, but many more informal meetings with residents and the island's elected and business leadership; and

WHEREAS, he has illustrated his commitment to the people of Guam through initiatives and his dedication to enhancing the Sailor/local veteran relationship, and in meeting the unique challenge of a resident community military retiree population significantly larger per capita than most regions and installations; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral French astutely balanced resource application and skillfully brought to fruition the initial stages of construction of a new \$5M Veterans Community Based Outpatient Clinic in a location more accessible for Guam veterans; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral French, a staunch advocate for quality of life for his Sailors, applied that same dedication to enhance the quality of life for all island residents by spearheading the revitalization of an ambitious community relations engagement strategy; and his personal encouragement of the character building value of volunteering, in a joint Navy / community

1 effort, resulted in weekly individual community service beautification projects

2 by Sailor volunteers, including, his own personal hands-on beautification

3 efforts in various island villages and schools; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral French recognized the crucial role of education in any community for the nation's future, and under his guidance and support this same community service program matched every command with every village and public school in a sister village and sister school status, thus making thousands of volunteer Sailors available to support ongoing school projects to assist in the enrichment of Guam's youth, thereby also setting the example of community service as a lifelong endeavor, in which Sailors and Guam's youth can develop leadership, character and responsible citizenry; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral French was instrumental in guiding the initial stages of the move of the U.S. Marines from Okinawa, in one of the largest peacetime build-ups in Naval history, whilst endeavoring to ensure the island community was well-informed, despite the incredibly complex initiative involving local, federal, and foreign governments with diverse and complicated political, legal and financial issues; and

WHEREAS, his commands deployed hundreds of Sailors in support of Operations IRAQI FREEDOM and ENDURING FREEDOM, while simultaneously developing benchmark programs and policies on how to

- 1 sponsor and support Sailors and their families before, during, and after
- 2 deployment; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Rear Admiral French's selfless actions, tireless efforts, and
- 4 unwavering commitment to excellence make him overwhelmingly deserving
- 5 of his selection for promotion to Rear Admiral Upper Half; and
- 6 WHEREAS, in mid-July, Rear Admiral French and his family will report
- 7 to San Diego, California, to assume his latest Flag Command of Navy Region
- 8 Southwest in August 2009; now, therefore, be it
- 9 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trenta Na*
- 10 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the
- 11 people of Guam, commend and congratulate Rear Admiral William D. French,

- 17 commitment to our island, region and country as he concludes his tour on
- 18 Guam as a Naval Officer; and be it further
