Relative to joining the nation in recognizing the practitioners and participants who contribute to making drug courts work and who, through their efforts, take significant strides to reduce drug usage and crime, especially during the month of May 2009, "Drug Court Month".

- 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I
- 2 MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:
- WHEREAS, the year 2009 marks the Twentieth (20th) Anniversary of the
- 4 Miami-Dade Drug Court, the first Drug Court in the United States of America.

- 1 The Court sparked a national revolution that changes the face of the American
- 2 Justice System; and
- WHEREAS, the Drug Court movement has grown from the twelve (12)
- 4 original Drug Courts in 1994 to two thousand three hundred one (2,301)
- 5 operational Drug Courts and three thousand four hundred ten (3,410)
- 6 problem solving courts as of December 2008; and
- WHEREAS, for the past twenty (20) years, Drug Courts have been
- 8 restoring lives, reuniting families and making communities across this nation
- 9 safer; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Drug Courts provide focus and leadership for community-
- 11 wide partnerships, bringing together public safety and public health
- 12 professionals in the fight against drug abuse and criminality; and
- 13 **WHEREAS**, while sixty to eighty percent (60% 80%) of drug offenders
- 14 sentenced to prison recidivate, and over forty percent (40%) sentenced to
- probation recidivate, only seventeen percent (17%) of Drug Court graduates
- 16 recidivate; and
- 17 WHEREAS, results of more than one hundred (100) program
- 18 evaluations and at least four (4) meta-analytic studies have yielded definitive
- 19 evidence that Drug Courts are demonstratively effective and they significantly
- 20 improve substance-abuse treatment outcomes, substantially reduce drug
- 21 abuse and crime, and do so at a less expense than any other justice strategy;
- 22 and

WHEREAS, over twenty-five thousand (25,000) judges, prosecutors, 1 attorneys, substance abuse and rehabilitation professionals, law enforcement 2 3 and community supervision personnel, researchers and educators, national 4 and community leaders, and others dedicated to Drug Courts and similar types of treatment programs are healing families and communities across the 5 6 country; and

WHEREAS, Friday, May 15, 2009, marks "National Drug Court Commencement Day", and May 2009 marks "National Drug Court Month", which celebrates the promise of recovery and restored hope to Drug Court graduates and their families; and

WHEREAS, all judges, support personnel, prosecutors, attorneys and rehabilitation professionals, law enforcement and community practitioners, who promote and help in the fight against drug abuse and criminality, not only during "Drug Court Month," but all year long, have earned our sincere gratitude and appreciation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people of Guam, join the nation, during the month of May 2009, "Drug Court Month," in recognizing the practitioners and participants who contribute to making drug courts work and who, through their efforts, take significant strides to reduce drug usage and crimes related to drug dependency; and be it further
