WHEREAS, the late Honorable Dr. Rita Hocog Inos was born on May 12, 1954, in Rota, Marianas Islands, the eldest of seven (7) children; and

5 WHEREAS, due to the extremely limited educational infrastructure 6 available at the time in the former United Nations-administered Trust 7 Territory, which is now the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, 8 Dr. Inos was only able to attend the first nine (9) grades on her home island, 9 traveling to Guam and Texas in order to complete high school in 1972; and

WHEREAS, in the same year that she graduated from high school, Dr.
 Inos taught second (2nd) grade classes in Rota, pioneering vernacular
 instruction in *Chamorro*, both there and in Saipan; and

13 WHEREAS, Dr. Inos later graduated from the Bilingual-Bicultural 14 Training Program at the University of Hawaii, and began her association with 15 what is now known as the Pacific Regional Educational Laboratory (PREL) 16 during her undergraduate studies, an association which would continue 17 throughout her career; and

18 WHEREAS, Dr. Inos received a Bachelor's degree in Liberal Arts from 19 the University of Hawaii, Manoa; she performed Masters' course work in 20 Educational Anthropology at California State University; she received her 21 Master's in School Administration and Supervision from San Jose State 22 University; and later she received her doctorate from the University of 23 Southern California; and

1 WHEREAS, Dr. Inos was elected as Rota's delegate to the Second 2 Constitutional Convention in 1985 and chaired the Committee on Finance and 3 other matters; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Inos received recognition in 1989 and 1990 in "Who's
Who in American Education", and in "Glimpse into Pacific Lives – Some
Outstanding Women," in 1987; and

7 WHEREAS, Dr. Inos served with great distinction as the CNMI Public
8 Schools Commissioner from June 1998 to December 2005; and

9 WHEREAS, Dr. Inos was appointed to the Northern Marianas College
10 Board of Regents in February 2006 and became its chairperson in June 2006,
11 holding that position until July of 2008; now, therefore, be it

12 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on 13 behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and memorialize the legacy of the late 14 Honorable Dr. Rita Hocog Inos of the Commonwealth of the Northern 15 Mariana Islands; and be it further
