- WHEREAS, Dr. Whitfield always saw Anabelle as a person in need of care and compassion, and never as a disabled person with complex medical issues. Dr. Whitfield availed herself to Anabelle on and off duty whenever needed. Had it not been for Dr. Whitfield's care for Anabelle, there is no way of knowing how she would be today; and
  - WHEREAS, today, Anabelle is a beautiful, young woman who sees life without limits to her, and a lot is due in part to Dr. Whitfield's care. Dr. Whitfield has instilled a positive perspective of life not only to Anabelle, but to her family as well. Dr. Whitfield allowed Anabelle's family to believe that their future together could only get better with the continued care that Dr.

WHEREAS, in 2009, rather than Dr. Whitfield taking the day off to celebrate New Year's, she was at the hospital, where she received Anabelle's newborn sister to ensure that she, too, was in good health. Even after this, Dr. Whitfield continued to avail herself to ElizaEmma (newborn) and to Anabelle,

who "stole the Doc's heart," without ever expressing being tired, frustrated or
even that she'd rather be somewhere else; and

WHEREAS, for many children like Anabelle and their families who receive care from Dr. Whitfield, they will all be saddened that her time to leave Guam has come. Anabelle and her family have been touched by an "angel" in Dr. Yolanda Whitfield, via the United States Navy, and now she must leave to aid other children and families with the same genuine care and love that she had bestowed upon us; and

WHEREAS, during her tour on Guam, Dr. Whitfield has assisted many of Guam's military families and veterans in their medical needs. Many of Guam's military families and veterans wholeheartedly appreciate all Dr. Whitfield has done to assure that her patients get the best health care and services; and

WHEREAS, as a member of the Naval Hospital Guam family, Dr. Whitfield became the primary care physician for many families and their children, including Anabelle Therese Castro ("Princess") and ElizaEmma Castro Evangelista. Through Dr. Whitfield's exceptional level of care, compassion, and respect, the doors to enhancing the quality of life for Anabelle and ElizaEmma were opened, thereby providing a brighter future for both girls. Dr. Whitfield's care for Anabelle and others has not only improved their quality of life, but also has instilled greater hope within them; and

compromise for any reason. Under Dr. Whitfield's care, Anabelle's life was spared. In 2008, Dr. Whitfield referred Anabelle to Tripler Medical Center, Hawaii, where she was able to get an extension of Dr. Whitfield's excellent care through other specialists. Because of Dr. Whitfield's undying care and compassion for Anabelle, she received surgery which resulted in the drastic reduction of her dependence on a CPAP machine, which she used to treat her her sleep apnea; and furthermore, Anabelle's speech improved significantly, thus, increasing her self-esteem to become the young and vibrant woman she is today; and WHEREAS, Dr. Yolanda Whitfield epitomizes the definition of both the military and community servant. She has made numerous, significant and unselfish contributions to the people of Guam, including Anabelle "Princess" Therese Castro and her family; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people of Guam, commend Dr. Yolanda Whitfield for her unselfish efforts to assist our military families and veterans at Naval Hospital, Guam; extend to her a Dångkulo na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'; and wish her and her family "Fair Winds and Following Seas," as they depart for their next duty station; and be it further RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and
