Relative to recognizing and commending Michael J. Gawel, an employee of the Guam Environmental Protection Agency, for twenty one (21) years of public service, and to congratulating him on the occasion of his retirement from the Government of Guam.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN*: WHEREAS, Mr. Michael John Gawel was born in Chicago, Illinois, on
 April 26, 1946, to James and Ann Marie Gawel, as the only son among three
 (3) children; and

WHEREAS, after graduating from Glenbard East High School in
Lombard, Illinois, in June 1964, Michael furthered his education, graduating
from Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut, in June 1968, receiving a
Bachelor of Science degree in Biology; and

8 WHEREAS, from 1970 to 1973, Michael worked for the Peace Corps in 9 Suva, Fiji, teaching at the University of the South Pacific. During this time he 10 identified and documented the reef fish in Fiji, and in the process he 11 discovered a species new to science, *"Siganus uspi"*, a species of rabbit fish 12 endemic to the Fiji area, which has since become the National Fish of Fiji; and

WHEREAS, Michael's love for the ocean brought him to Guam to pursue a Master of Science degree in Marine Biology from the University of Guam (1973-1977), and while working on his "Corals" thesis, he discovered two (2) new species of soft corals, resulting in the naming of one (1) species *"Sinularia randalli"* after his professor, and one (1) species *"Sinularia gaweli"* after his family name; and

WHEREAS, Michael's first association with *Ahensian Pruteksion Lina'la Guåhan*, the Guam Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA), was during
 1975 while performing graduate work for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers;
 and

WHEREAS, from August 1977 to January 1980, Michael was employed
by the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands (TTPI) and headquartered in
Saipan as the Chief of Planning, developing environmental planning
guidebooks and plans, managing planning projects, and reviewing
Environmental Impact Assessments and Statements, and while in Saipan,
Michael met the love of his life, Isabel John, a TTPI employee from Chuuk
State, and they developed a strong and lasting relationship; and

8 WHEREAS, Michael returned to Hawaii and attended the University of 9 Hawaii at Manoa from January 1980 to January 1982, studying Urban 10 Planning and working as a Master Urban Rural Planner; and he was later 11 hired by the University of South Pacific at Suva, Fiji as an Instructor and 12 Fisheries Training Officer, where he taught marine science courses and 13 administered program and project research from January to December 1982; 14 and

WHEREAS, Michael then worked for the newly established National Government of Pohnpei, FSM, in Palikir, as the Chief of Marine Resources, from January 1983 to September 1991, administering programs in fisheries, aquaculture development, and coastal marine resources; and he also developed national programs, produced development plans and trained national counterparts; and

21 WHEREAS, while working in Pohnpei State, Michael and Isabel were 22 reunited and then were married in Chuuk State on May 28, 1983, later

returning to Pohnpei, where they started their family and were blessed with a
 daughter, Anne Marie, and a son, James; and

WHEREAS, on October 3, 1991, Michael began his eighteen (18)-year career with the government of Guam, beginning as a Land Use Planner for the Guam Planning Council/Bureau of Planning; a Planner IV with GEPA (1996-2000); the Administrator of the Coastal Management Program (2000-2004); and a GEPA senior planner, since February 2004; and

8 WHEREAS, Michael J. Gawel was promoted to the GEPA Chief Planner 9 position on February 21, 2008, and was charged with leadership and 10 management responsibilities for the Environmental Planning and Review 11 Division, his key responsibilities aimed at providing both internal and 12 environmental planning services, and also provided external representation of 13 the Agency's programs and objectives to various government, business, and 14 community stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, as Chief Planner, Michael also served in numerous 15 16 capacities, to include: Guam's Focal Point (representative) to the South Pacific Regional Environment Programme (SPREP); South Pacific Applied Geo-17 science Commission (SOPAC) Planner; GEPA Lead Response Activity 18 19 Coordinator (RAC); Vice-Chair, Guam Seashore Reserve Plan Task Force; 20 member of both the Navy and Air Force Restoration Advisory Boards; GEPA 21 representative to the Civilian Military Task Force on military expansion 22 issues, and a member of the Environmental, Infrastructure, and Natural 23 Resources Subcommittees; GEPA representative to the Coral Reef Initiative

Task Force and Marine Preserve Regulations Ad-hoc Committee; and member
 of GEPA's Employees Association; and

WHEREAS, in March 2009, Michael J. Gawel was recognized as the
GEPA 2008 "Supervisor of the Year", and he was the recipient of the Agency's
2008 "Integrity Award"; now, therefore, be it

6 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the 7 8 people of Guam, recognize and commend Mr. Michael J. Gawel for his outstanding public service to Guam and its neighboring Pacific islands, and 9 for his devotion to his work, as exemplified in the GEPA adage, "Todo y ni'lala 10 *y tano man uno* - all living things of the earth are one", during his thirty-seven 11 (37) years of experience in researching, planning and educating on 12 environmental matters in these Pacific Islands, and does further congratulate 13 14 him on the occasion of his retirement; and be it further

15 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on 16 Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and 17 that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Mr. Michael J. Gawel; to 18 Ms. Lorilee Crisostomo, Administrator, Guam Environmental Protection 19 Agency; and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
